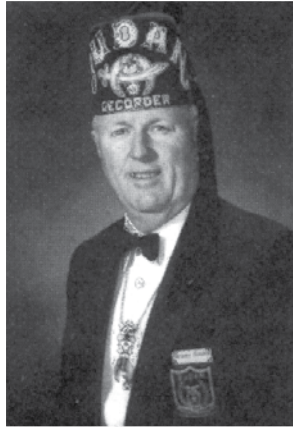

# RECORDER'S MESSAGE

Sudan's headquarters building in New Bern suffered a lot of damage from the recent hurricane named Irene. Rain water entered the building from the roof and around some windows and flood water from the river covered a good bit of the ground floor. All ground floor carpet was ruined. The recently installed



new roof over the main portion of the building held, but the other roof sections were compromised. The oriental style dome on top of the building leaked rain water. A large tree from adjacent property fell on the back of the building in the area of the old kitchen.

The temple was closed for two weeks due to the hurricane damage, but was up and running by 13 September. The office staff saved our computers and other electronic equipment by placing them up off the floor and covering them with plastic. Insurance adjusters and our insurance agent have all surveyed the damage and repairs should be completed before too long.

I should bring to your attention that renovations and repairs of Sudan's headquarters which began in 2010 are at a standstill due to lack of funds. Several Clubs, Units, members and Shrinettes have contributed funds, labor and other resources. Much thanks to those who have been able to help. Only about twenty-five percent of the identified items needing attention have been addressed. Much more must be done if our temple is to be brought up to the standard it deserves. I urge all Clubs, Units, Nobles and Shrinettes to consider contributing to this most worthwhile project, if your resources will permit.

Membership development continues to be a concern. As of this message preparation, Sudan has 333 NPD's. Please remind others to pay their dues. Our temple operates on member dues and temple fundraisers. This year's main fundraiser is a \$10,000.00 cash giveaway and the drawings for it will be held 19 November 2011 during the Fall Ceremonial. If you need tickets please contact the temple office.

Please know that the Potentate and entire Divan much appreciate what you do for Sudan Shriners and the "WORLD'S GREATEST PHILANTROPY". Because of you, many children have far better lives

because of expert medical care received at Shiner's Hospitals for Children.

And, just think of what Sudan's Roadrunners provide for those children who need special medical care. These members pick up children and their parents all over eastern North Carolina and drive them to various Shriners Hospitals. A number of our Roadrunners have made over 100 trips. Imagine the dedication it takes to be a Roadrunner. I tip my fez to the Roadrunners and all Nobility and their Ladies. You are the GREATEST!

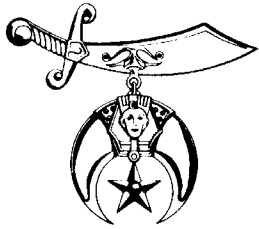

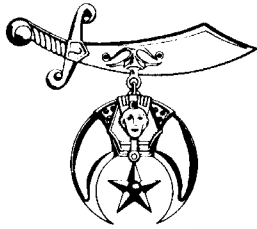

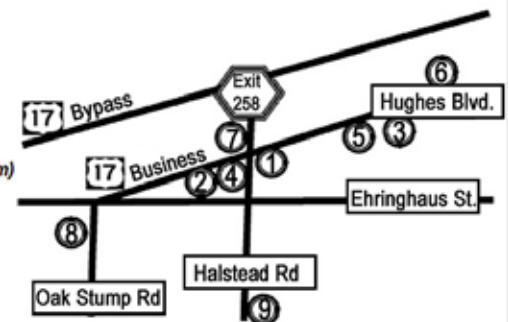

# SHRINE FUNDRAISING

## POLICIES & PROCEDURES SHRINE FUNDRAISING

### INTRODUCTION

Because Shriners have been the driving force behind Shriners Hospitals for Children, it has become natural to associate the Fez with this charity. However, the Shrine of North America and Shriners Hospitals are separate and distinct legal corporations.

Shriners Hospitals for Children is incorporated in the state of Colorado, and it operates 22 hospitals. Its purpose is to provide medical care to children with disabilities without regard to race, creed, sect or nationality. The treatment for the children is provided at no cost. This is the Charitable corporation.

The Shrine of North America is incorporated in the state of Iowa, and it presently has 191 unincorporated fraternal associations in Canada, Mexico, the United States and Republic of Panama. We know them as Shrine Temples. This is the Fraternal corporation.

A study done by Shriners International Headquarters found that Shrine Temples conduct more than 2,000 fundraising activities annually. Many of these fundraisers are strictly for the Temples – and this is perfectly acceptable. Other fundraising activities are for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children – and this is also perfectly acceptable.

However, the individual purchasing a ticket, product, etc., or the donor, should be advised, in advance, how the proceeds will be used. This pamphlet is intended to provide guidance to the Temples, units, clubs and Nobles in their fundraising activities so there can be no criticism directed at them that the solicitation did not conform to the requirements of the law or was deceptive or misleading.

### TYPES OF FUNDRAISERS

There are two types of Shrine fundraisers – Charitable and Fraternal.

**CHARITABLE FUNDRAISERS** – Where 100 percent of the net proceeds benefit Shriners Hospitals for Children.

**FRATERNAL FUNDRAISERS** – Where the net proceeds benefit the Temple, which in turn may distribute them as it sees fit. For example, profits may be disbursed to the Temple general fund, a building fund, to clubs and/or units, to Shriners Hospitals for Children, to local community or Masonic related projects (DeMolay, Masonic Home, etc.) or any combination thereof.

### **PROCEDURES THAT APPLY TO ALL SHRINE FUNDRAISING ACTIVITIES**

All fundraising must comply with the law of the land; that is, the law of the jurisdiction where the activity takes place. This includes national, state or province, and local laws.

The use of the name Shriners Hospitals is governed by §503.10 of the bylaws of Shriners Hospitals.

All fundraising is governed by General Orders as may be issued on that subject by the Imperial Potentate.

**Insurance.** Your attention is particularly called to that portion of the existing General Order #1 pertaining to insurance. Strict compliance is required. All contracts must be reviewed and approved by the Temple Potentate after receiving the advice of the Temple attorney.

All fundraising promotional materials (including Temple publications) must include a statement indicating the major entity benefited by the funds [Statement of Purpose].

### **STATEMENTS OF PURPOSE**

All fundraising promotional materials must contain a STATEMENT OF PURPOSE. Below are examples for each type of fundraising activity.

### **FOR CHARITABLE FUNDRAISERS:**

“Net proceeds from this (activity, event, etc.) are for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children.”

### **FOR FRATERNAL FUNDRAISERS:**

“Net proceeds from this (activity, event, etc.) are for the benefit of XYZ Temple/Unit/Shrine Club.”

**DISCLOSURE** (for Fraternal fundraisers) “Payments are not deductible as charitable contributions.”

*NOTE: All fraternal fundraising materials must include both the statement of purpose and disclosure.*

### **CHARITABLE FUNDRAISERS**

It should be emphasized at this point that a Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), a Shrine Temple/club/unit, an organization of Nobles, or affiliated/appendant corporations SHALL NOT engage in any charitable fundraising effort other than for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children.

When a decision is made to conduct a charitable fundraiser, the responsible Noble (club/unit president, committee chairman, etc...) must submit a written request to the Temple Potentate having jurisdiction thereof. If he approves, the Potentate must then obtain the written consent of the Imperial Potentate and Chairman of the Board of Trustees. This request shall be sent to the Executive Vice President – Imperial Council, Shriners International Headquarters, P.O. Box 31356, Tampa, Florida 33631-3356. Final approval for a charitable fundraising activity is effective upon the Temple’s receipt of a Charity Activity Form. If a request is denied by the Imperial Potentate and Chairman of the Board of Trustees, the Temple Potentate will receive a full explanation in writing.

### **One hundred percent of the net proceeds from charitable fundraisers must be given to Shriners Hospitals for Children.**

Expenses for operating the event must be actual, and no labor charges can be made for volunteer work by Shriners and/or their families.

Under certain conditions, existing General Orders allow the use of a portion of funds raised for the hospitals to be used for patient transportation.

All solicitation materials, tickets, programs and documents must include factual information (Statement of Purpose) regarding use of the proceeds.

Information about our hospitals (obtainable from the Imperial Public Relations Department), such as patient success stories, facts and figures, photos or other appropriate material, may be used in programs for **charitable** fundraisers.

The Temple shall report the results of each charitable fundraising activity within 60 days of the activity to Shriners Hospitals for Children on the Charity Activity Form provided to the Temple. A Temple that fails to remit the net proceeds within 60 days of the activity shall be assessed interest retroactive to the date of the activity.

The Temple shall maintain detailed financial records of all fundraising activities involving Nobles, clubs, units, organizations of Nobles or affiliated / appendant corporations for a period of seven years. Details of all revenues and disbursements shall be maintained in such financial records.

**State Solicitation Laws:** Some states have solicitation laws that may require Shrine compliance. Temples must have their attorney review such laws. By way of example, the State of Florida requires that the following statement be included in all printed solicitation materials, receipts, written confirmation, or reminders of contributions soliciting charitable contributions for Shriners Hospitals. The statement must be conspicuously displayed in all capital letters.

SHRINERS HOSPITALS FOR CHILDREN ARE DULY REGISTERED WITH THE STATE OF FLORIDA AS REQUIRED BY ITS SOLICITATION OF CONTRIBUTIONS ACT. THEIR REGISTRATION NUMBER IS CH 433. A COPY OF THE OFFICIAL REGISTRATION AND FINANCIAL INFORMATION MAY BE OBTAINED FROM THE DIVISION OF CONSUMER SERVICES BY CALLING TOLL-FREE 1-800-435-7352 WITHIN THE STATE.

REGISTRATION DOES NOT IMPLY ENDORSEMENT, APPROVAL OR RECOMMENDATION BY THE STATE.

**FRATERNAL FUNDRAISERS**

A Noble (in his capacity as a Shriner), or a Shrine Temple/club/unit, or an organization of Nobles or affiliated/ appendant corporations must obtain the prior written consent of the Temple Potentate having jurisdiction thereof before engaging in any fundraising activity.

There can be no representation, express or implied, that the proceeds will be for the benefit of Shriners Hospitals for Children.

When the Potentate gives his written consent for a fraternal fundraising activity, a copy of the same shall be mailed to the Executive Vice President – Imperial Council. Further, any printed materials pertaining to the fundraising activity shall be sent to Executive Vice President, Imperial Council if so requested.

All promotional material, tickets, programs and documents must contain a Statement of Purpose and Disclosure.

Information about our hospitals may be used in programs for fraternal fundraisers *provided that each contains the appropriate Statement of Purpose and Disclosure.*

This information must appear in conspicuous location used lettering bold enough to be easily read. Programs and other 'booklet' type materials must include the Statement of Purpose and Disclosure on the front cover or the first page. The Statement of Purpose and Disclosure should also be included as a part of each fundraising activity advertised in Temple publications.

The Temple shall maintain detailed financial records of all fundraising activities involving Nobles, clubs, units, and organizations, Nobles or affiliated/appendant corporations for a period of seven years. Details of all revenues and disbursements shall be maintained in such financial records.

# Sudan's Dues

Shortly after its inception in November 1916, Sudan's total membership totaled about 260 with 125 of these admitted through initiation ceremonies at the first Spring Ceremonial in Rocky Mount in 1917. Sudan's membership has grown over the years and despite higher membership numbers in the early 1960's and 1970's, Sudan still touts one of the highest memberships in all of Imperial Shriners at 5,700+. With that established, it is unfortunate that there is still a burden of pursuing nobles in order to get annual fraternal dues paid.

Many things contribute to missed dues payments including discarded or misplaced notices, change of address, lack of discretionary funds, and simply forgetting to pay them. Dues notices for the coming calendar year are mailed in late September giving nobles 3 months to get them paid. Dues notices were mailed on September 27th for calendar year 2012.

Nobles should be reminded that notices are still mailed from Sudan Shriners office, but contain references to Imperial Shriners. Many have taken the Imperial Shriners material and tossed it in the trash can as a promotional or solicitation literature, not realizing that they have discarded their upcoming year due's notice. Dues cards are Imperial Shrine generated documents and not a Sudan Shriners document. Please be aware of that!

Sudan Shriners Divan and administrative personnel have made a focused effort to make dues payment as easy and convenient as possible for all nobles in order to avoid repeated mailed notices and telephone calls to ascertain a member's status.

Currently Sudan offers mail-in payments and on-line payments by personal bank credit card or through the on-line payment service PayPal. Nobles should be informed that the PayPal service is involved in processing the bank card payment but here is no additional charge to the noble for processing this payment. This allows nobles to make payments with Visa or Mastercard, with the card balance paid off with other personal monthly charges as finances permit. The payment buttons are at the top of our website page at [www.sudanshriners.com](http://www.sudanshriners.com) and are provided for your convenience.


Dues payments should be submitted by January 1 of each calendar year. In addition to January 1 being the obligatory due date, a current dues card is required to be admitted to Sudan Shriners' ceremonial functions and to participate as a Sudan unit member at parades.

In the event that a noble cannot make a dues payment because of financial or health related difficulties, a request for "Relief Fund-Assistance Form" is available on-line or can be mailed from Sudan's offices. A documented reason for the assistance is required and it must be submitted with recommendations by 2 nobles in good standing. Once received, it will be reviewed and acted on accordingly.

If a noble decides that for personal reasons, they wish not to continue their affiliation with the Shriners International fraternity, they should insure that the current year's dues are paid and contact the temple office and inform them that they wish to demit. A noble demitting in good standing is a respectable exit from a fraternity that they may wish to rejoin at a future date as situations change.

As a voluntary petitioner to a prestigious fraternity, responsibility to maintain membership in good standing falls on the noble himself and according to the Shriners Creed: "As individuals we pledge ourselves to integrity, virtue and nobility of character. Our intentions will be honorable, our relations will be trustworthy and our spirits forgiving of each other."

Nobility of character is truly reflected in a member's attention to insuring due's payments are received on time, that is why they are referred to as a "Noble".
