



Noble Bob Nunes At 29.....





Hi, my name is Acsa Zavala and I'm going to tell you my experience with Shriners Hospital for Children. It all started when I was in the womb created by God and God thought "Hey, let me make another masterpiece" and I was created. My mom's pregnancy with me was complicated and risky.

Honduras is where I was born and that's where my experience of going to a Children's Hospital started. When I was four years old I went into surgery because when I was born I was diagnosed with a

condition that is called Arthrogryposis which means multiplex congenital (AMC) or simply Arthrogryposis. This condition is when a person has a congenital joint contracture in two or more areas of the body. Because of that condition I also had cleft feet. A diagnosis of cleft feet means that a child's feet have a deepened space that extends toward the ankle; there may be missing toes or other abnormalities. Clefts are usually V-shaped and that is the reason why I had surgery at 4 years old. During my recovery after surgery my first steps were at four years-old while I still had casts on. Yes, I walked with casts on both feet and with long pins in my ankles! The doctors were surprised and so was my mom. After that I walked all over the place. Like the saying "A happy camper is a happy kid".

A couple years passed and I started receiving care at Shriners Hospitals for Children in Greenville, SC and I am still going to Shriners Hospital for Children.

I am now 19 years-old and am a growing teenager moving toward adulthood. My experience has always been and still is wonderful with the Shriners. I have met great people, like my drivers who take me to the hospital and have watched me grow from the age of 13 until now. It is amazingly crazy. Why, you may ask. Well, because everyone that I have met in the hospital has been wonderful and they have helped me and other kids who need surgeries. I do want to thank my doctor who is Dr. Gibson that did the surgery on my right ankle in 2013 because after that surgery I was able to walk better and I am able to wear a variety of shoes that I was not able to use as a kid because of the way my foot was shaped. Overall I thank "Shriners Hospital for Children" for making me feel better and for the wonderful experience. God's blessings to those who God has put in my footsteps.

My journey with Shriners Hospital for Children in Greenville South Carolina, has surely been an unforgettable one. I was born with Spastic Diplegia Cerebral Palsy. I started attending Shriners nearly thirteen years ago, on July 15, 2005. Before attending Shriners I couldn't walk far distances; I could stand for about five minutes then crawl the remainder of the way. Before attending Shriners doctors told my parents that I would never walk. We are very grateful to God and Dr. West-

berry that they are proven wrong. Of the seven surgeries I've had Shriners has done six of which included, cast all the way up both legs at the same time, and metal plates and screws in my right ankle and both my feet. The progress I've made on this journey has been amazing. I use to have a wheelchair, walker, braces, and crutches, all of which I no longer use. I am forever grateful to Dr. Westberry and his surgery team for helping me to walk. This experience has changed my life and helped shape me into who I am today. Each one of the staff members are very special to me. I am always greeted with a smile and made comfortable. Shriners was more than a hospital it was a home away from home. It was also a blessing to meet some of Shriners greatest Roadrunners! Mr. J.B. Price and Mr. Tony Ferrel will forever have a special place in my heart.

We found out around 28 week's gestation that our sweet little boy would be born with bilateral clubfeet. As a mother, I was completely devastated. We soon were told about Shriner's Hospital and all of the wonderful things they do for children and their families. Conner started treatment by getting his first set of casts at six days old. We traveled every week for two months, followed by a procedure, and 23 hour wear for his braces which he did for three months. When Conner was six


I would like to share my experience with the Sudan Shriners and Shriners Hospitals for Children in Greenville, SC. My son was diagnosed with cerebral palsy just after his first birthday. I was terrified of the unknown and what the future would be. My son has been a fighter since birth. It has been a very long journey the past 17 years. In the beginning we went to several doctors and everyone had a different treatment plan in mind. At the

age of 5 we decided to do surgery to try and correct some of the issues he was having with his muscles being tight. The surgery was not successful and we were so mislead. The surgery was performed at one of the most recognized hospitals in North Carolina. At that point I didn't know what to do or where to go. Then one day we were walking to our car in a parking lot and a gentlemen came up to us and asked if we had ever been to a Shriners Hospital for Children. I replied "no" but we had heard a little bit about them. Cristian has always walked with a walker since age two so he stands out in a crowd and that's why the man approached us.

So I went home and thought about what the man said and I reached out to Shriners Hospitals for Children in Greenville, SC. We made an appointment and met with the doctors. I have to say that when you go to the hospital you see children with disabilities that you don't see every day. It is very humbling and overwhelming at first. After our first appointment I knew that this was the place for Cristian to be taken care of. They understood his needs and explained what our options were and what the future would look like. We have been going to the hospital for close to twelve years now. Cristian has had several surgeries and treatments. We have always been treated like family. We see the same friendly, caring and wonderful staff every time we go back.

At the age of seventeen my son took his first steps without a walker or crutches or any assistance. We thank God for introducing us to the Shriners Hospitals for Children. The man that came up to us and told us about the Shriners is a big part of why Cristian can walk today. We share our story and try and tell anyone that we meet with disabilities about the wonderful hospitals. We appreciate and thank you for all of the help and support we've received.

The Importance of Lawn Mower Safety

Shriners Hospitals Wants Kids to Stay Safe

Shriners Hospitals for Children® is committed to helping keep kids safe, and injury-free.

Although they may seem like a common household tool, lawn mowers are one of the most dangerous items in our homes. Thousands of people are hurt while using lawnmowers each year – these injuries can include deep cuts; loss of fingers, toes, and even limbs; burns and broken bones. However, many lawn mower-related injuries can be prevented by following some safety guidelines.

Lawnmower Usage Safety Tips

Keep Children Safe

- Children under 6 years of age should be kept indoors during mowing.
- Make sure children are a safe distance away from the area you plan to mow because rocks and debris often can shoot out while the lawn mower is running.
- Keep a close eye on children when a lawn mower is in use. Make sure they do not run into the mower's path.
- Never allow children to play with the mower, even when it is turned off. A lawn mower is not a toy.
- Children should be at least 12 years old before operating a walk-behind lawn mower and at least 16 years old to operate a riding mower.
- Never allow children or any other passengers on a riding lawn mower because of the potential for falling under the mower and sustaining serious injuries.

Weather and Terrain

- Do not cut grass when it's wet because it can cause your feet to lose traction and slide.
- Do not use a mower on hills or slopes, to avoid having it tip over and cause injury.

Prior to Mowing

- Read your mower's instruction manual and familiarize yourself with the product prior to use.
- Use a mower with a control that stops it from moving forward if the handle is released.
- Clear your lawn of items such as nails, sticks, rocks, toys, sports entertainment, dog bones, wire and equipment parts, so the debris does not cause damage or hurt anyone.

During Usage


- Wear close-fitting long pants and long-sleeved shirts, eye protection and heavy gloves.
- Do not wear sandals or be barefoot. Wear sturdy shoes with good traction.
- Do not wear jewelry.
- Always fill and start lawn mowers outdoors.
- Never fill the tank with gasoline when the lawn mower is on or hot.
- Do not remove safety devices or guards on switches.
- Never reach underneath a mower because the blade remains engaged even when it is shut off.
- Do not mow in reverse unless absolutely necessary.
- To remove debris from mower use a stick or broom handle, not your hands.
- Always shut off the engine before leaving the mower unattended.
- Stay away from the engine cowling, as it can become very hot and burn unprotected flesh.
- Wait for blades to stop completely before crossing gravel roads, unclogging the chute, or removing the grass catcher.
