Lady Janet's fundraising efforts are to send our Shriner Kids to a week-long camp, specifically designed for "Our Kids". 

Another Chapter In Sudan History - January 2019



The Shriners Hospitals for Children has meant the world to Ar'mondre and myself and without the Shriners help Ar'mondre's life would have turned out so differently.

Our family turned to Shriners for help when Ar'mondre was 10 months old because he was diagnosed with osteogenesis imperfecta type 2 (brittle bone disease). It is a disease that can be fatal and often shortens the life of the patient. After the doctor sent him home with 6 months to a year to live, we felt hopeless

and decided to get help and researched his condition. We were advised to take him to the Shriners Hospitals for Children in Montreal Canada because they care for children with this disease. We asked for help from our local Shriners and they advised us to contact Ms. Donna Horton at the Shrine Center and she helped us fly back and forth to the hospital.

Without the help of the Shriners we would have never known that Ar'mondre had a better chance for life. The Shriners gave us hope when the doctors in our hometown said he would not survive, or sit up without support and never walk. With the help from the Shriners Hospital for Children Ar'mondre has done all three. Shriners also helped with meals, hotels, wheelchairs, braces and a walker. Without the help from the Shriners this would not have been impossible. We thank God for the Shriners Hospital for Children.

Kayson Brown



Kayson began his journey in 2013. One evening after his bath when he was getting dressed, I noticed that his spine was curved. I showed his mother and we made an appointment with his pediatrician. During the appointment his doctor also said it didn't look right and asked if I had time to take him for x-rays. Of course, I said yes. After the results we were referred to the Shriners Hospital for Children in Greenville SC since his pediatri-

cian said she had not seen a curve that serious. The doctors there took more x-rays and his curve got to a 96 on both top and bottom. They tried many different things to control the scoliosis. They put Kayson in braces at the start. It did

help some but the curve continued to get worse. Then they tried casting. That helped more than the braces but the curve stayed the same but the awesome medical staff would not give up. Dr. Mendelow told us about a new type of rods that could possibly help. They were magnetic rods. Our prayers were answered and in February of 2016 Kayson was approved for the surgery. After the surgery Kayson was upset about the rods and asked the doctors to take them off his back. The answer was no but all the doctors and nurses would not let Kayson's spirit get down. They made sure to check on him often and kept him comfortable. The nursing staff helped get Kayson on his feet walking around and they never gave up on him.

It's now two years later and Kayson is doing awesome and growing like you wouldn't believe. He doesn't let anything get him down and nothing stops him. Thank you for all you do for Kayson and all the children that need your help. The entire staff at the Shriners Hospital in Greenville SC and our local Sudan Temple in New Bern NC are awesome. Once again thank you for all you have done for Kayson and will continue to do.

Ryan Hart

Ryan Hart made his first appearance in Greenville, NC on August 12th, 2003. He was born 45 minutes before his twin brother (Brett Hart) to the parents of Dana Hart and Marsha Barnett. Ryan spent two weeks in the NIC unit until finally being released from the hospital to return to his home in Wilson, NC. When Ryan and Brett began to crawl there were several differences that were noticed when comparing their development. It was at this point his parents began to question if there was an issue with Ryan's development. Around the age of 1 year old Ryan was still not walking and continued with his modified crawl to get around. They decided to get another opinion on Ryan's progression and went to the Duke Children's Hospital where Ryan was diagnosed with cerebral palsy. Ryan soon began receiving Botox injections at Duke Children's hospital to help with the spasticity in his lower extremities. Ryan had several injections in his legs along with the help of AFO braces to help him walk. Months later his doctor transferred to California and there was no other doctor at Duke that had experience of giving Botox injections to children. A couple of years passed before they received information that a hospital in Winston Salem was offering the same treatment where he had several more injections. Then the family met Noble Dean Hawley with the Wilson Shriners. Dean submitted Ryan's case to the Shriners in Greenville, SC and he was off for his first appointment at the Shriners when he was six years old. The Shrine Hospital seemed to be a little different for Ryan, although it's still a hospital, it had a homely vibe to it and Ryan seemed to be very relaxed. Everyone was very caring and made you feel like family when you had a visit. Ryan met with Dr. Westberry at the Shriners and they discussed options for Ryan. The Botox injections continued and the AFO braces until Ryan was 8 vears old. Dr. Westberry had recommended doing surgery on Ryan's legs to release the muscles to prevent Ryan from walking on his tip toes. A few months passed and they made the decision to proceed with the surgery. Ryan spent a week in the hospital and 6 weeks in cast from his knees to his feet. After the six weeks were up they returned to the hospital for cast removal and fitting for new braces. What a difference the surgery had made for Ryan! He was still a bit unsteady on his feet, but was able to do the many things that he had seen his brother do for years. Seven years have passed since Ryan's surgery and he has visited the Shriner's Hospital every six months in those seven years to visit with Dr. Westberry.

Ryan is currently 15 years old and in the 9th grade at Wilson Preparatory Academy in Wilson, NC. He hopes to pursue a career as a Sports Broadcaster. Ryan is a fan of the Denver Broncos and loves deer hunting with his Dad, football, and basketball. He has recently obtained his learners permit and can drive a car. This is Ryan's story and thanks to the Shriners Hospitals for Children it's a great one.

While you are visiting Nashville, also be sure to check out the Country Music Hall of Fame® and Museum, located a block away from the popular honky-tonks of Broadway. Often called the "Smithsonian of country music," the museum seeks to collect, preserve, and interpret the evolving history and traditions of country music through exhibits, publications, and educational programs.

In addition to its incredible music scene, Nashville offers even more to do, explore and discover. The city is known and loved for its characteristic warm, Southern hospitality; unique and exciting first-class food options; boundless spectrum of nightlife; and dynamic, rich history. Another must-see attraction in Nashville is the Parthenon, located in beautiful Centennial Park. Built in 1897, the Parthenon is a full-scale replica of the



original Parthenon in Athens, Greece and also serves as Nashville's art museum.






