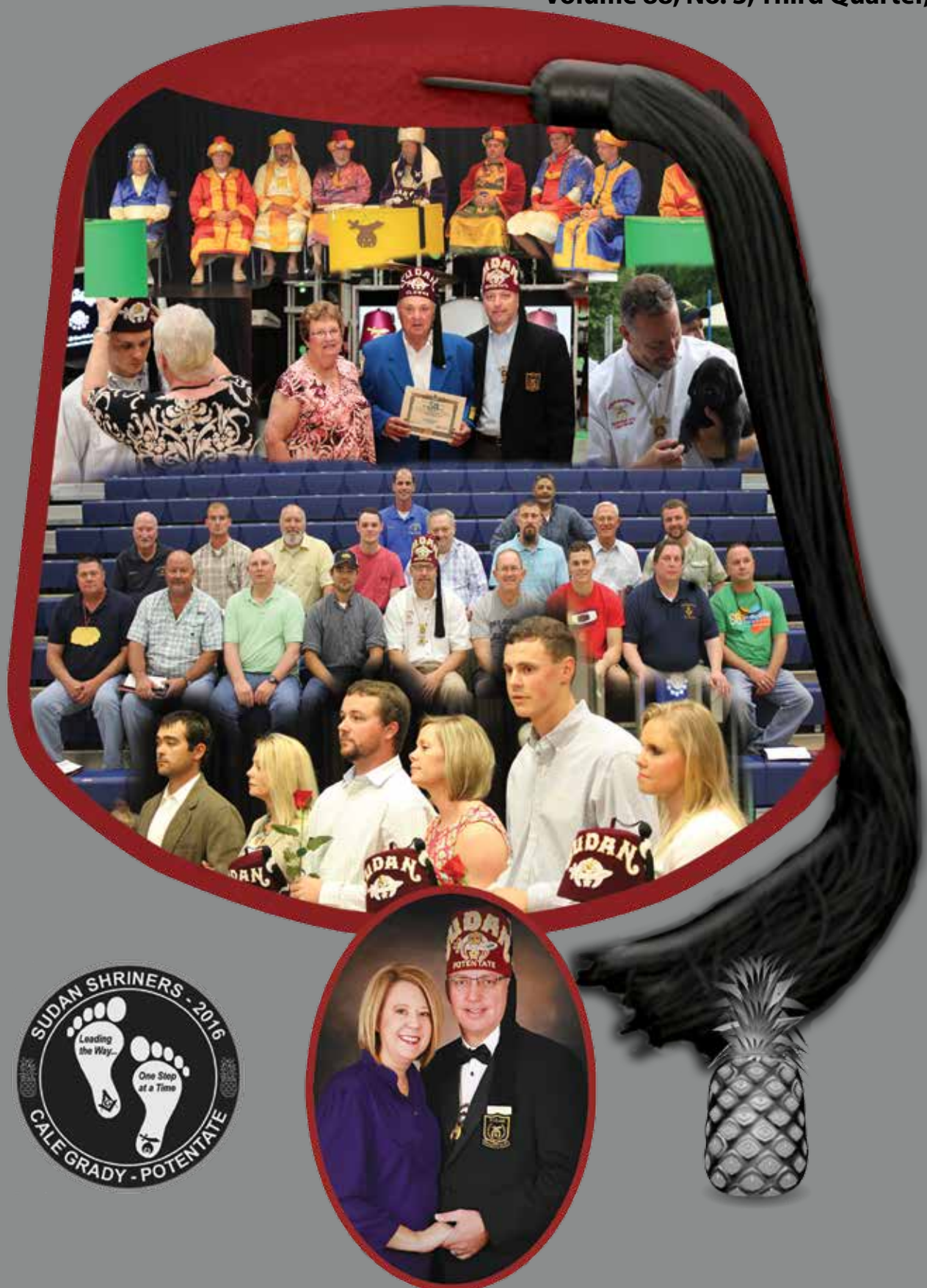

Students Learn of Shriners' Benefits

ARAPAHOE | Two second-grade classes at Arapahoe Charter School spent the year collecting can tabs to help other children.

On Thursday, during a special celebration, 42 second-grade students in the classes of Michelle Gaskins and Emily Harper gathered together to hear from members of the Shriners and a young lady who received help from the organization.

Shriner Greg Murphy, a staff member at Arapahoe Charter School, said this was the second year the second-graders participated in the can tab collection.

"The first year we raised 54 pounds, this year we went to 85 1/2 pounds," Murphy said. "It's an awesome class to be able to produce this many can tabs from home and from people they know."

Fellow Shriner Alvis Collins, a Sudan Roadrunner, agreed with Murphy's assessment.

"These children that did this project for the whole year, I'm just so grateful that they're healthy children," Collins said.

The Shriners Hospitals for Children provide family-centered care to children up to age 18 with orthopedic conditions, regardless of the families' ability to pay.

Christina Woodruff, a 16-year-old recipient of the

Shriners care and assistance, spoke to the classes about her experiences with the organization.

"They have helped me by giving transportation," she said. "They've healed me. I am beyond words."

Her mother, Carrie Woodruff, said the Shriners helped change her family's life.

"My daughter was born premature with cerebral palsy and her gait and balance have been unequal and her right foot needed surgery," she said. "A Shriner approached us in a restaurant in Greenville and he asked me if my daughter had orthopedic issues and I said, 'yes, she does.' It was quite obvious. He said, 'Well, I'm a Shriner and I'm going to help you.' His name was Joe Fuller."

Fuller gave the family the phone number for transportation coordination.

"It was June 7 when we met Mr. Fuller and since then they've transported us about six times from Greenville, N.C., to Greenville, S.C.," Woodruff said.

The specialists there provided major evaluation and motion analysis more thorough than the Woodruff family had previously experienced.

"Their team of physicians, physical therapists, psychologists all got together and then they decided what to do with her foot and leg. She actually had about eight surgeries at one time inside her right foot," Woodruff said. Woodruff is friends with Gaskins, which is how they were able to coordinate the visit.

"To give back, it's just indescribable to know that we could show the children live and in color, so to speak, Christina and her leg, and they saw the incision and they saw the wheelchair and they saw where she didn't walk and then she stood up and she walked so it just makes it more real to them. It makes what they did to collect these tabs, now they have a reason for doing it. It's not just because Mrs. Gaskins said so, they'll be able to relate to Christina and see what their efforts all year long helps provide for another child," Woodruff said.

The can tab collection was part of the students' larger lesson this year.

"I want them to know that there are other people out there who need things and that we can help them and we've talked about gratefulness and being helpful and treating others the way we want to be treated so that's been our theme this year, to help others and to treat others the way we want to be treated," Gaskins said.

The collected tabs will be taken to a recycling center in South Carolina where they are weighed. The recycling company then sends the money for the tabs to the Shriners Hospital to be used for things like orthopedic boots, amputee socks, and games and toys to help children while they are in the hospital.

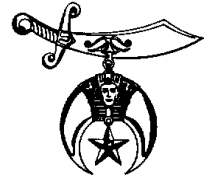

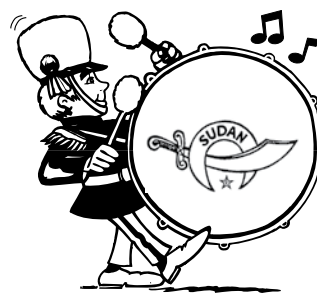

2016 Plaque Sales On A Roll

Our Plaque Sales Chairman Johnny Albritton has 2016 on a roll. At this time, we have accumulated \$38,065 in sales. Noble Johnny and the Wilson County Shrine Club are on the way of winning the award again for the fourth year. I don't really believe the issue is winning an award, although they are nice. Noble Johnny Albritton is all about the bottom line - making sure we take care of our patients! We are seeing a lot of help this year with Plaque Sales from a lot of shrine clubs throughout Sudan. Hope Mills, Wayne, Elizabeth City, Robeson, Martin, Pamlico, and Wilmington Shrine Clubs are helping to make this a record year. Of special note, Chowan Shrine Club which closed last year has some dedicated nobles working that area to help. They have made 24 sales so far in 2016. With what we have raised, we will surpass the \$50,000 raised in 2012. It is the first of July and we still have six (6) more months to work. If each of the units and clubs would buy just one \$100 Plaque, we will have an all-time record fundraiser. Noble Johnny is willing to visit and assist clubs and unit with the program. 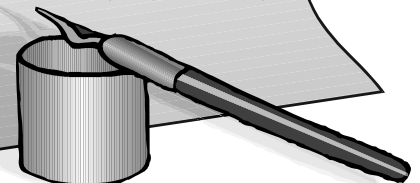

Important

Change In Insurance Carrier

Shriners, being as unique as they are, with parades and fundraisers have been insured with the insurance company called Praetorian, that was contracted by Shriners International. For any special events, extra coverage could be underwritten by Thompkins Masonic Insurance Program. On March 1, 2016, Praetorian lost the contract and the new carrier is AIG. With this said, AIG is not covering some of the same fundraisers that was covered in the past.

Sudan did not receive a lot of pre-notice from Robinson & Stith (Sudan's insurance carrier) concerning these changes and therefore we have run into a couple of issues as to whether our special Fraternal/Charitable events will be covered. We are working daily with Robinson & Stith concerning these issues.

Clubs and units must submit their requests for approval on the Sudan Consent Form(s) while making your initial plans. The insurance company is asking for at least 60 - 90 days out from an event. If the event is not covered under the program, other coverage can be obtained. Additionally, **WAIT** to publicly announce and advertise your event until after you have the required consent and have the proper insurance coverage. You will have to provide a copy of that Insurance Certificate identifying that particular event.

New Insurance Coverage 2016

Excluded events currently on the policy are listed below. It applies to not only the temple, but the clubs/units that are part of the temple. This exclusion has been part of the Shrine/Masonic Program for years. It appears that a lot of unknown events are taking place that may or may not be covered now. Fish Fry's are OK.

If the unit/club obtains their own coverage for these events, they must list the Sudan Shriners as an individual insured and provide the office with a copy of the certificate.

Excluded: Aircraft (owned, hired and non-owned), Aircraft Rides (including hot air balloons, air shows or parachuting shows); carnivals or amusement rides (mechanical amusement devices); inflatable amusement devices; animal rides in conjunction with a circus or carnival; campgrounds – owned by or leased to any insured; circuses or ice shows; rodeos or horse shows; turkey, trap or skeet shooting; athletic events such as baseball, football, basketball, foot races (including marathons) and soccer games where the Shrine temple has the responsibility of organizing, selecting the participants and staging or producing the event itself, and where an admission is charged to members of the public. Golf tournaments involving members and their guests as participants are not considered an athletic event.

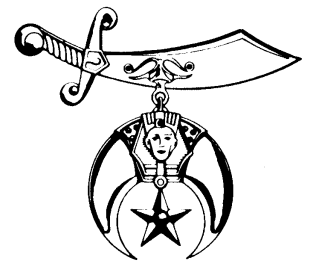

FIREWORKS SAFETY



- Fireworks that are thought to be safe, like sparklers, can reach temperatures above 1000 degrees and can burn users and bystanders
- Mishandled fireworks can result in severe burns, scars and disfigurements that can last a lifetime
- Families should attend community fireworks displays handled by professionals rather than using fireworks at home

LAWNMOWER SAFETY

- Only use a mower with a control that stops the mower blade from moving if the handle is let go
- Children younger than 16 years old should not be allowed to use ride-on mower. Children under 12 years old should not use walk-behind mowers
- Wear appropriate shoes and clothing
- Never smoke or use any type of flame around gasoline
- Gasoline has one purpose – to fuel an engine



DOG SAFETY



- Consult with a professional to learn what breeds of dogs are the best fit for your household
- Dogs with histories of aggression are not suitable for households with children
- Be sensitive to cues that a child is fearful or apprehensive about a dog. If a child seems frightened by dogs, wait before bringing a dog into your household
- Spend time with a dog before buying or adopting it. Use caution when bringing a dog into a household with an infant or toddler.

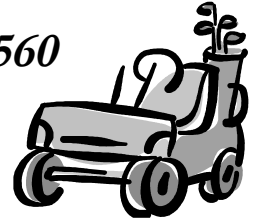

Sudan Roadrunners At Work



This is a special article dedicated to the hardworking Sudan Roadrunners. Year after year they contribute hours and hours of dedicated service for our patients. The Roadrunners turned out in force for their April 2016 monthly meeting. Illustrious Sir Cale Grady and our Recorder, George Raecher were present and acknowledged and praised the work of the entire unit. Without a doubt, this Sudan unit takes a lot of pride in what they do for our patients and demonstrate on a daily basis "LOVE TO THE RESCUE". The article below describes a special part of the Roadrunner operations. Needless to say, all have contributed and we want to recognize our Sudan Ladies for their contribution.



Since November 2010, seven Sudan nobles and wives have made 202 trips to Shriners Hospitals for Children in various locations and saved Sudan's Transportation Department over \$9,000.00 in hotel expenses.

This year's Unit Director John Pugh, Jr. and his Lady Carol, were the first team to transport a patient to our hospital and now have made 27 trips together. Noble John himself has driven a total of 70 trips to Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Noble Alvis and Lady Harriett Collins have made 60 trips together with Noble Alvis making a grand total of 96 trips. Harriett Collins said that over her five years of

driving Sudan's Hospital Transportation Vans, the one thing that stands out in her mind was when she and Alvis drove twenty-one year old Guadalupe for her last appointment. Three years prior Guadalupe had sustained a serious head injury in a car accident. Harriett and Alvis drove her to Shriners Hospitals for Children in Greenville, SC for her first appointment. Her father had to carry her into the restaurant for that first trip. However, when they stopped for lunch in December 2015 Guadalupe walked alone and was able to get into the van without assistance. Harriett said, "I never had a better experience than to see the progress that she had made."

Noble Joe Fuller has made a total of 214 trips to our hospitals in the eight years that he has been a Roadrunner. Lady Barbara made five trips with him and three of those trips were to Shriners Spinal Cord Injury Hospital in Philadelphia. Based on those trips with Bryce Floyd's family the Fuller's have become close with Bryce Floyd's family and visit them often.

Noble Ben Grady and Lady Peggy have made 71 trips as a team with Noble Ben making a total of 123 trips since he started driving in 2011. A special trip for the Grady's includes a trip to Shriners Hospitals for Children - Houston, Texas to pick up a patient after chest surgery.

Noble Greg Padgett and Lady Anne have made 24 trips as a team. Noble Greg has a total of 59 trips. Greg and Anne are both school bus drivers and can only drive in the summer and during holidays which is a great help filling trips during those times when we are short of drivers.

Noble Wayne Sawyer has made a total of 55 trips as a Sudan Roadrunner with Lady Jeannie making four trips.

Noble Curtis Ormond, no longer an active driver, made over ninety trips to SHC and his wife Phyllis made (11) trips with him.

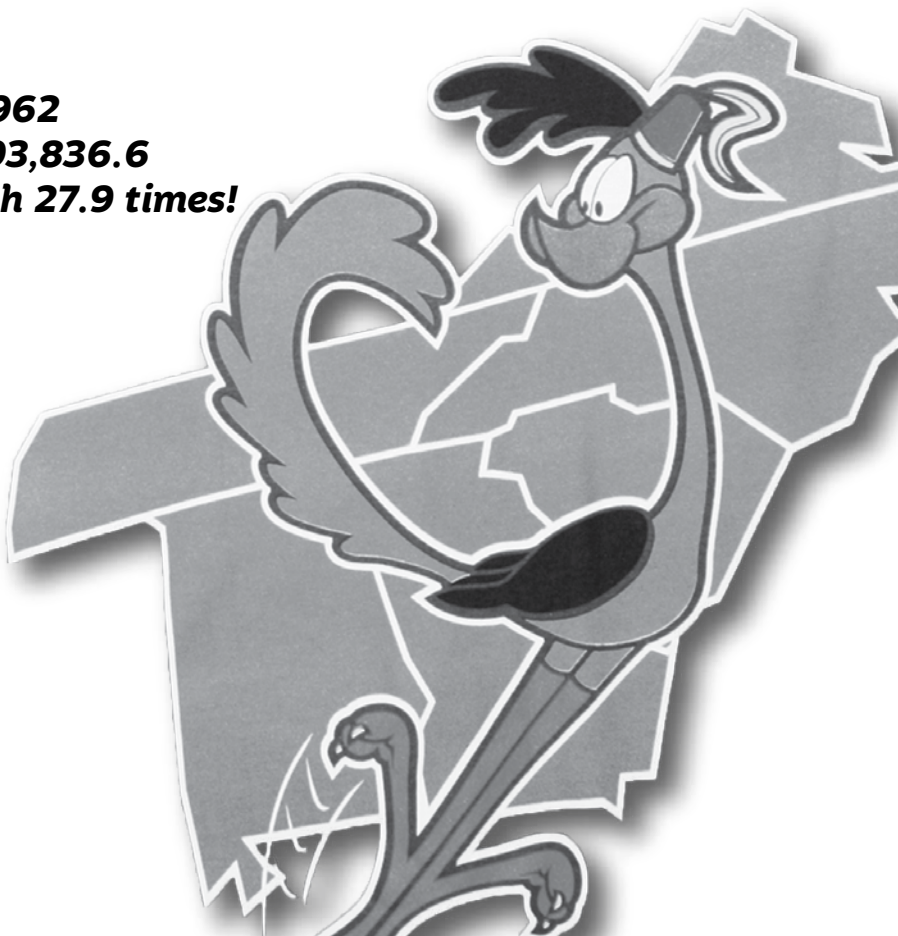
