





# Honoring and Remembering Imperial Sir Jack Jones



IMPERIAL SIR JACK H. JONES worked tirelessly over the past 37 years to support and serve the fraternity at the national level. He served Shriners International as Imperial Recorder for 36 years, Executive Vice President for five, Imperial Potentate for one, and received countless accolades and honors, including the Imperial Potentate's Award

of Merit, which is the highest honor in the fraternity. Jones was also known as one of the most dedicated and genuine people to work alongside – a reputation he has earned by leading the fraternity with grace and pride.

Imperial Sir Jack Jones was initially elected Imperial Recorder in 1979, and served in that position, or as Imperial Potentate, until his death.

During much of his time as Imperial Recorder, he also served as Director of Membership Development. Imperial Sir Jack Jones also served as Chairman of the Masonic Relations and DeMolay Committees during the majority of this time.

During his time as Imperial Potentate, Imperial Sir Jones focused on bringing people together, developing modern membership solutions and realizing and recognizing the fraternity's global impact and its potential. Jones' theme for the year was "Unity Wins." Imperial Sir Jack Jones did not permit this confinement to a wheelchair to confine his spirit or his travels. He was a frequent speaker at Masonic events throughout the world and was a well-known and well-respected Masonic leader.

While serving Shriners International, Jones also met many high-profile figures, including the Queen of England and President Ronald Reagan, who he had the privilege of personally making an honorary member of the fraternity. While serving as Imperial Potentate, Jones also had the pleasure of meeting the world's oldest man and 113-year-old Shriner, Walter Breuning.

"Imperial Sir Jack Jones has been a fixture on the boards of Shriners International and Shriners Hospitals for Children for decades," said Imperial Potentate Chris Smith. "With the passing of Jack Jones, all Masons and all Shriners have experienced a great loss. He was a truly great Shriner, an example to all."

# The Story Behind the Shoe



#### Rebekah Farnham



My daughter Rebekah who has mobility issues and Down's Syndrome and I were approached by a wonderful Shriner (Neal Davis) from the Sudan Flag Unit in Dunn, NC. He saw a need and gave me a card and helped us get into see a pediatric orthopedic surgeon in Greenville, SC.

The Shriners provided us with a family room and a ride down and back during the first visit. What a wonderful experience that was!

After over 6 years of tests and poking and prodding at other hospitals, these wonderful professionals not only had figured out what was wrong, within 45 minutes they had a plan of action!

The level of professionalism is only matched by the level of CARE! This hospital has the heart of each child in their hearts. Even though there were many patients there, we never felt like "just another number" or "one of many" we felt like FAMILY! Even the kitchen staff were wonderful, offering to make anything just so Bekah would have something to eat SHE enjoyed. How many places would even care to do this?

My heart melts when I think of how caring these people are, how wonderful and I feel we are the better for having come here. Thank you for providing such a loving atmosphere to get better.

## Jaxon Sadler



Complications began very early on in our pregnancy with Jaxon, we were informed that Jaxon had a 'bell shaped' thorax and always measured behind or smaller than he should be, and that was indicative of a possible diagnosis of down syndrome or skeletal dysplasia (Dwarfism). I was referred to a specialist at ECU who dismissed both diagnoses but was unsure of the cause of the complications.

Due to the slow growth, ultrasound scans were performed often, during our last ultrasounds Jaxon was diagnosed as IUGR (Intrauterine growth restriction) which meant he had stopped growing at approximately 34 weeks. Since this put both myself and Jaxon at risk, I was induced and Jaxon was born at 38 weeks 6 days weighing only 5lbs 2oz.

Besides his small size and poor feeding Jaxon seemed perfectly healthy during the first few hours after birth. However, the first night after his birth Jaxon began having seizures, and apneic spells in which an xray was done the following morning where a possible curve was noted.

Dr's decided it was best if Jaxon was life flighted to Vidant Medical Center's Childrens hospital in Greenville, NC where he could receive more specialized care.

Upon arrival he was diagnosed with an intracranial brain bleed which was causing the seizures, poor feeding/aspiration of his food, and scoliosis. After being stabilized and dr's deciding to place a feeding tube Jaxon was sent home 1 month later with a referral to Duke University for his scoliosis.

Jaxon had his first appointment at Duke when he was 2.5 months old where we were told he had a 16 degree curve yet due to his age we would just use the wait and see approach before treatment was discussed and follow up. 3 months later we had his follow up at Duke and were informed his curve had progressed from 16 degrees to 54 degrees which is extremely rare for children as young as Jaxon.

With little information and feeling unsure about the diagnosis we sought a second opinion from The Shriners Hospital in Greenville SC. The Shriners had us scheduled for our first appointment within 3 weeks of our initial phone call.

On January 4th 2016, our family traveled the 6 hours from our home in New Bern NC to Greenville SC. While our first appointment didn't go as we had hoped and we received news that no parent wants to receive we left feeling hopeful that we were making the right decision.

Dr. Pete at the Shriner's hospital confirmed Jaxon's diagnosis of scoliosis, but also noted Jaxon didn't just have a typical curve he also had a 'hump' or "Kyphosis" which makes our treatment even more challenging. With the diagnosis of rapidly progressive kyphoscoliosis we were given 2 options, begin treatment with a procedure known as Mehta Casting (A plaster cast applied while the child is under general anesthesia using a specialized table which allows the doctor to manipulate the spine and get optimal correction) which may or may not be successful in correcting the scoliosis or the other option was to allow Jaxon to progressively get worse and eventually allow this horrible disease to kill him. The latter was not an option so we chose to begin our casting journey.

May 10th 2016 we once again traveled to Shriners Hospital in Greenville SC for Jaxon's first cast to be applied. During this appointment we received the bad news that Jaxon's

curve had gotten worse and was now at 81.5 degrees. The staff at the hospital were there to help us through the entire difficult process. After the procedure was over we got great news that Dr. Pete was able to get Jaxon's curve from 81.5 degrees down to 40 degrees in cast. But informed us we do have a challenge on our hands as he had never seen a curve this severe in such a young child and a "cure" with casting alone may not be possible with Jaxon's other challenges that he faces as well, especially with his slow growth.

Even though this was all news we as parents dreaded hearing, it was a huge relief knowing there were drs who truly cared for their patients and we had options to make his life the best it could be without fear or worrying that we may not be able to afford the care.

We now travel every 7-8 weeks for a new cast to be applied, and as of current, Jaxon has been casting for 1 year having his 8th cast placed on May 23rd 2017.

Even through all of the casts and the scoliosis battle Jaxon is a happy, energetic 2 year old who doesn't allow anything to stop him or get in his way. He is all boy and loves all things cars and trucks (especially fire trucks!) and lives to run, climb and play on everything. None of which would be possible for him without the care he receives from the Shriner's Hospital.

For this, we are ever so thankful for The Shriner's and all that they do for our family and so many others like us.

## Isabella Ruth Rogers



Isabella was born June 11, 2007 in the state of Michigan. She was a beautiful baby girl, healthy and happy. When Bella turned 3 months old, weighing 10 pounds, she almost died at the hand of the man who was supposed to be her protector. He broke 17 of her small little bones, shook her causing brain and behind the eyes bleeding, slammed her into a door frame resulting in 3 skull fractures and sexually assaulted her. She was not supposed to live. She lay in her hospital bed hooked up to life support for 9 long

days. She is a miracle! She woke up and the sparkle had returned to her beautiful blue eyes. She had to learn once again how to suck a bottle. Mercifully she doesn't remember any of the acts of torture that were inflicted upon her tiny body.

We were told she may not be able to see, that the possibility of walking was slim, that we could expect mental damage and that she might be in a vegetative state if she survived. Our precious Bella not only survived, but she is one of the happiest children I have been blessed to have in my life. She

is in a mild learning disability classroom and has been on the A Honor Roll for the past year. She reads and does all of her work on a computer. She is very knowledgeable about a computer and IPad. Bella has such of a love for people. Wherever we go she asks people around her "how are you doing today?" She loves a Hope Mills Shrinettes known to her as "Chicken". We recently had the honor of attending a club event and she was more concerned over Chicken than she was of her own self. That's the kind of child our Bella is.

Bella was first introduced to the Shriners around the age of 3. She was diagnosed with bilateral hip dysplasia. Dr. Westberry started her in UFO's and told us we would probably know by the age of 6 if she would ever walk. We kept our hopes high and focused on therapies that would benefit her. In June 18, 2012, during a Parkton/Lumberton Shriners Meeting, Bella was presented with an Amtryke Tricycle. My Alumni Association raised some of the money, some was received by personal donations and the large balance was paid for by the Shriners. Mr. Tommy Hall of Parkton Shriners, assembled the trike for Bella. She enjoyed the trike Tuesday, June 19th, 2013 and more tragedy struck Wednesday, June 20, 2012. Bella was attending physical therapy and her therapist picked her up to proceed to the back to begin therapy and accidentally trip over a toy laying in her pathway. Both fell to the floor resulting in Bella's left femur receiving a compound fracture. The pain caused her to go in and out of consciousness. She was treated and casted at a local hospital but one week later we were sent to Shriners Hospital due to complications. Dr Westberry had to take her back to surgery and redo what had been done earlier at local hospital. What marvelous care we received at our Shriners Hospital! A couple of years later after continued monitoring of her condition of bilateral hip dysplasia Bella had to have surgery. The surgery was done once again by Dr Westberry and it was a total success. A year later she went back in to surgery to have all of the hardware removed. It was after this surgery that Bella was referred to Dr Mendelow to watch her for scoliosis. He was hoping she could wait for surgery until she reached puberty. This did not happen. At the age of 9, in October 2016 we were told Bella had to have spine surgery. She was scheduled for January 30, 2017. Dr Mendelow performed the surgery implanting growing rods along her spine. She has done great! As a result of the surgery she was 4" taller. We were only in the hospital for 5 days and Bella had a remarkable recovery at home. She is now back in school, has returned to her therapy sessions and is doing quite well. We will return to the Shriners Hospital in a couple of months for surgery to extend the rods and to do a procedure to release the muscle tightness in her left groin.

I truly do not know what we would do without our Shriners for their continued dedication and hard work to fund the hospital for all of our children. God bless our Shriners.

# My Story By Timothy Tompkins



My story started when I was 6 months old, my mother started to notice something wrong with my leg. When we went for my 6-month checkup the PA we saw said, it just his bones growing and he sure nothing is wrong with my leg. Well of course over the next 4 months my mom continued to watch my leg, so when we went back for my one year old checkup she pointed it out to my doctor this time. The doctor examined me more and I was diagnosed with a genetic disorder called neurofibromatosis, and I must

be referred to an orthopedic doctor for my leg. We went to a doctor right here in Pitt County. This doctor told my mom that I had a boeing of a tibia bone and that I will have to wear a brace. This doctor told my mom that we couldn't due surgery, and we would have to wait until I broke my leg on my own to decide what we would do. My mom asked what will happen if he breaks it, and she said we will have to wait until it happens. I saw this doctor until I was 2 then we moved to Jacksonville to be closer to my dad's work. The doctor in Jacksonville referred us to Chapel Hill. The doctor there told us the something. The only thing he said different was I didn't' need my brace because eventually I would break my leg. My mom asked this doctor what will happen if I break my leg, this doctor told my mom the same thing we will have to wait and see. My mom was tired of not getting any answers, so my Aunt Lucy and Uncle Tommy Brady referred us to Shriners. My first appointment was in 2003 it was like no other doctor we went to, we could tell they were all about the kids. We took x-rays which the ladies there made me feel great and I wasn't scared like I was at other doctors. Then we saw my doctor, Doctor Pete. When doctor Pete came in the first thing he did was introduce himself to me I never had a doctor do that before. Doctor Pete than told my mom that I had a boeing of the tibia bone and my fibula had a gap in it and because of this we couldn't so surgery. He also told my mom that I will have to wear a brace to protect my leg to help me not break it. My mom asked him what will happen if I break my leg, doctor Pete was straight to the point with my leg. He said If I break my leg it will be rod are amputation depending on how I break it.

I am now 17 years old and I have been a Shriners patient for 14 years and I go to Greenville South Carolina every 6 months. I haven't broken my leg and there has been no change in my leg. I have met some great people. We have always had some great drivers carry us to the doctor. I have had 2 drivers that have taken be the past couple of years and we love them like family and they are Joe Fuller and Don Davenport. I want to think all of you for what you do for us Shriner Kids.

Ben's Shriner journey began in 2004 when he was 3 years old and he is now 15 years old. Ben has spina bifida. 
