Allow me to bring you somewhat up to date on what's happening in Shriners International and Sudan. You will note I used the term "Shriners International". Transition to this term more accurately identifies the scope of today's Shrine. We are truly international and becoming more so.

By the time you read this message, the 2009 Imperial Session in San Antonio, Texas may be history. This Imperial Session is most important due to the serious matters facing the Shrine and Shriners Hospitals for Children.

About the fraternity – Imperial projects are underway to help update our image, messaging and communications about who we are and what we do. Imperial Sir George Mitchell and his committee have rewritten the ritual for approval at the session. Requests from Europe, Puerto Rico and maybe the Philippines will have been presented at the session for dispensation of new Shrine Temples.

Recently in Uruguay 38 candidates were created as new Shriners, including the Grand Master and Deputy Grand Master of Brazil. Ceremonials have been held in London, England and Culcea, Romania. Imperial Sirs Doug Maxwell, Alan Madsen and Chris Smith attended these events.

New logos are now used on all Imperial marketing and communication materials. This new image can be found at www.shrinershq.org (splash page).

A new, private website or web community called Shriners Village is on tap for introduction at the Imperial Session. This will be available for all members in mid July. This will be the place for Shriners to find information about membership tools, events, news, history, Shrine sports, forms, presentations, temple operational guides, public relation material and more.

Although membership has declined over the last 30 years, there is now an increase in new members in almost half of our Temples. To educate potential new members a new website is under development, www.beashrinernow.com. This new website will allow Non-Masons and Masons to learn more about becoming a Mason and Shriner. This site will help men connect with Blue Lodges and Shrine Temples.

What's happening with our hospitals? Financial matters are forcing consideration of measures to meet a growing gap between revenues and expenses. As I prepared this message, it should be noted that nobody knows what is going to happen with our hospitals. Rumors have spread far and wide, but only the Representatives to the Imperial Council will vote to determine what path will be taken. Some suggestions have recommended the closure or change of status of five hospitals. What do I mean by change of status? Some hospitals



could become day surgery centers rather than full hospitals. Those five hospitals are: Spokane, Erie, Springfield, Shreveport and Greenville. The hospitals which have been identified and recommended for consideration of change are all located in small to medium size metropolitan centers as defined by the U.S. Census Bureau and the Department of Labor. It is said that location is the critical element to the long-term success of a highly specialized pediatric hospital system. Remember, as I write this message, no one knows what will happen with the hospitals. I'm sure the Imperial Session will see much emotional discussion. I know of no Shriner who wants to close or change any hospital. Our commitment to serving children has not changed or diminished, but in order to continue the "World's Greatest Philanthropy" it is necessary to find a way to balance the budget so we can secure the financial future of Shriners Hospitals for Children.

What's happening in Sudan? Things are generally going well. We still have far too many NPD's. I know you will do what you can to encourage these Nobles to pay their dues. Our office administration is working great. Our office staff continues their dedicated work. We continue searching for ways to save money. The office reorganization implemented last year has saved thousands of dollars. Our new telephone system is about half the cost of the old one; our new copy machine and contract has saved hundreds of dollars; and because we have the option of having the U.S. Postal Service deliver mail to the office, we will probably eliminate the post office box address in the near future. All these cost reduction measures help keep our dues at \$59.00, one of the very lowest of all the 191 Shrine Temples. Where else can a Shriner and his Lady find three Ceremonials a year, each with two dances, each with all the hospitality food and beverage and socializing one can absorb. Many Shrine temples charge a registration and/or some other fee for members to participate in Ceremonial events.

Don't forget the "Cold Sands" Ceremonial along with the third quarter Stated Meeting on 12 September at the temple. Why a "Cold Sands"? We think there are many Master Masons who want to become Shriners but cannot devote a whole weekend, which may include the cost of hotel rooms, food, etc., to join the Shrine. This Cold Sands Ceremonial will allow a Master Mason to spend just part of one day and be created a Shriner.

The South Atlantic Shrine Association is again in Virginia Beach on 17 – 19 September. Our Fall Ceremonial will be in Wilson on 20 – 21 November. I hope to see you and your Lady at these events.


Pitt County Shrine Club News

Walter Breuning – Oldest Mason and Shriner

Walter Breuning is the oldest living male in the USA. He is 112 years old and is the oldest Mason and Scottish Rite Mason in the world. Walter is also the oldest living Shriner in North America although there are Shriners who have been members longer. I first met Walter in 1993 when he was Secretary/Manager of the Great Falls Shrine Club called the Elbon, he was 97 years old at the time. I visit my daughter who lives in Great Falls every 2 years and each time I make it a point to visit Walter. But now he is such a celebrity all interviews are made through his Press Secretary Tina. In researching Walter's interviews there was no mention of his Masonic travels and that was what interested me and follows below.

Walter started his travels as a Mason on May 5th 1925 when he was raised to the sublime degree of Master Mason in Great Falls Lodge No# 118. This Lodge was originally formed in 1918 with 181 charter members. He was elected Master of Great Falls Lodge No# 118 in 1934. His original Lodge merged with Cascade Lodge #32 of which he is a life member. He was Secretary of this Lodge from 1944 to 1968.

In the late 1930s he petitioned Scottish Rite and received his 32nd degree on January 2nd, 1939. He next received his KCCH on September 19th, 1948 and on January 11th, 1957 received his 33rd degree. In 1950 he was Venerable Master of the Lodge of Perfection, Valley of Great Falls and has served the Valley in other capacities. In 1968 Walter was in charge of the dedication of the new Scottish Rite Temple for the Valley of Great Falls. He was the Temples' Reunion Director from 1940 to 1988 and has also written several articles for the Scottish Rite Journal.

Walter was created a Shriner on May 12th, 1951 and is presently a life member of Algeria Shriners located in Helena, Montana. He is also a life member of Great Falls

Shrine Club, which is located in the basement of the Rainbow Retirement Center. He was Secretary/Manager of the Shrine Club from 1980 to 1994 and at the age of 98 retired from that position.

Eric Newhouse, a Greatfalls Tribune Projects Editor reported that Walter was 112 years and 99 days old as of 30 December 2008. Walter was born on September 21st, 1896 and was raised in DeSmet, SD. He began working with the Great Northern Railroad in 1913 at the age of 16 and 1918 was transferred to Great Falls, Montana, where he served out the remainder of his 50 year career. Walter was married to Agnes Breuning in 1922, she passed away in 1957 and he never remarried, they had no children.

It was a privilege and an honor for me to interview Walter and to give him the few things from Imperial, Sudan Shriners and the Wayne Shrine Club.

At the April Shrine/Shrinette meeting, the Wayne Shrinettes presented their first annual scholarship of \$1,000.00 to Kyle Chegwidden, who was one of our hospital children. Kyle is a very dedicated, intelligent and dependable young man. He is also very active in his community and church. He is on the church Drama Team and does puppet shows and helps with VBS. He does have physical challenges, but his limitations have never held him back from doing what he sets his mind to.

Kyle has a brother, Aaron, who is also in the Shrine Hospital patient program. Kyle's parents have always encouraged him to do what he could to help others.

Kyle Chegwidden's Essay

I was admitted to the Shriners Hospitals for Children in 1991 when the doctors diagnosed me with femur fibular disorder. It was a condition that was causing my right foot to grow inwards. The doctors were able to give my parents different options as to how they could treat me, but in the end, it was clear that my foot being amputated was what would be best for me. I was fitted with a prosthetic leg a little while later. I had been to the Shriners hospital for about fifteen years for various check ups and additional surgeries. During those fifteen years, the doctors and all of the staff did so much for me. They provided top of the line care to me without ever charging my family anything. Everyone at the Shriners hospital was real eager to answer any questions, or just to be a listener when I had something really heavy weighing on me. Most importantly though, the Shriners hospital gave me a chance to grow up and have as normal a life as possible. While other hospitals I'd been to previously said I'd never walk, Shriners saw potential and they never gave up on me.

Today I'm a student at Wayne Community College as a transfer student. I'm working hard at getting my associates in sciences. I'm trying to get all the prerequisites I need to transfer over to the UT Southwestern Medical School where I would be able to get a bachelors degree in prosthetics and orthotics. I realized as early as

middle school that I would enjoy working with children who have been born with disabilities like me.

Aside from being a full time student, I also participate in a work study at the college. I'm a tutor and I help my peers with their work. I specialize in chemistry and computers. I enjoy this job because I can help out students, and make them feel more comfortable about their class work. It gives me a chance to help others while continuously helping me review all of my subjects as well. I found this opportunity at the Academic Skills Center at my college. I was going there to receive help with my homework. The tutors at Academic Skill Center were able to help me get a better grasp on what I was studying. At the end of the semester, they asked me if I'd be willing to help students by being a tutor. I jumped at the opportunity to give back after all the help I had received.

During the summer, I have a part time job as a pyrotechnician. I shoot fireworks during the fourth of July. It is a very exciting job because I get to travel to various places and do fireworks shows that I know are being watched by multitudes of people. While it could be considered a very dangerous job, I like to see it as another adventure that I get to live. It is just another example of how the Shriners hospital impacted my life. I know I would not be able to do this job, which involves a lot of moving and running, if I did not receive the care I did.

I am especially eager to work at the Shriners hospitals, and to give back to the place that changed my life. I wear a smile every time the Shriners hospital comes up in a conversation. I have always been very vocal about working there with everyone. I remember talking to guidance counselors at school about the different careers and I made it well known in high school that those were plans that were set in stone. While I attended Charles B. Aycock, everyone knew I had a special interest with helping others. I fulfilled all of my high school requirements in time to graduate six months before the rest of my class. I was invited back to be a part of the graduation, as well as attend their award ceremony where I was chosen for the John B. Chase award. The John B. Chase award goes out to a new student each year that has faced obstacles in their lives and went up and beyond their expectations. I felt honored to be chosen to receive that particular award.

I can't thank the Shriners hospital enough. Words simply aren't enough, and that is why I want to give back in any way possible. One of the workers that really I respect is Ron Brooks. He works in the prosthetic and orthotics department of the Shriners hospital. He built several of the prostheses I wear. Ron has a real sense of humor. I know while I was in the hospital, he'd do his best to make me feel more comfortable when I may have been feeling a little uneasy. He paid special attention to how my prostheses was fitting, and would gladly help me until I was thoroughly satisfied with how everything was working. Ron has been so much help ever since I decided that prosthetics was the career I wanted to pursue. He's been coaching me and giving me a lot of advice about college, and getting my bachelors' degree. I know I'll always be thankful for all the generosity he has shown me.

Everyday I'm thankful to wake up and go to school. I know now that I have a chance to go and chase after something that I'm very passionate about, and to make a difference in others lives as well. I really want to be able to help a child like me. I know I would be able to relate, and I would be able to have some insight to what the patients are going through.

I thank you from the bottom of my heart for considering helping me turn my hopes and hard work into a reality.





Mercedes

Mercedes is a miracle. She was born 4 months early and weighed only 1 pound 5 ounces. The doctors said she wouldn't live through the night so good byes needed to be made. They didn't realize God had big plans for her. She lived through the first night; then the next, then the next. She is now 15 and living each day to the fullest.

Since she was small the only place to get an I.V. line was her umbilical cord. When it started to deteriorate her I.V. line was removed and put into her jugular vein.

Instead of going in it went through, filling her tiny body with fluid. Her blood vessels in her left leg collapsed and within a few days her toes and heel on her left foot began to die and fall off. The growth plates in her leg were also damaged.

By the time she was learning to walk her left leg was many inches shorter than her right and the bones had not formed in her ankle and foot. She had used a special shoe and brace to keep her stabilized. When she was 5 a friend's neighbor stopped by to drop off some homemade jam. He was a Shriner and instantly made it his mission to see her taken care of. He made many phone calls that very night and before he went home we had a sponsor, filled out the application he always had in his car, and appointment for an assessment and a friend.

The first three years were spent waiting to see how fast she was growing and how slow her leg was growing. It was decided by her and the doctors at the Shrine Hospital for Children in Chicago, that it would be best to amputate and work with a prosthetic.

The hospital staff was very good to her and the whole family, alleviating any fears and calming nerves. They were so loving and kind that there is a nurse that still keeps in contact almost eight years later. Every 6 months it's time to get on the van with our Shriner friends and get her check up. She is working on her third leg and is looking forward to her next.

Money has never been an issue with the staff at any of the hospitals. When it worked out better for her to go to an independent prosthetics clinic it was taken care of too. We never went hungry while on our trips either. The gentlemen driving us were always very friendly and made everyone they came in contact with feel at ease.





Thailand Burma Border Consortium (TBBC) provides relief to some 160,000 refugees from Burma residing in 10 refugee camps along the Thailand Myanmar border. Joel's family lived in the Mae La Karen Refugee Camp with his family just inside of Thailand, before moving to Eastern North Carolina. Tony's parents moved here as refugees from the same camp on September 22, 2005. Tony was born the following year in New Bern, NC. Myanmar, their homeland is torn with war and sadness but it is also a land known for the dozens of golden pagodas that dot the landscape as well as elephants and tigers.



April 23, 2009 seventeen year-old Joel and three year-old Tony rode in Sudan's hospital van with Roadrunners Howard Cashwell and Tommy Forrest for their appointments at Shriners Hospitals for Children in Greenville, SC. The hospital coordinated the two boys appointments so they and their mothers could ride the van together.

Tony was seen at the hospital because of an automobile accident in January 2007 that took the life of his father when a truck driver crossed the center lane and crashed head on. Tony sustained fractured vertebrae in his neck but the doctors were able to use bone from his leg to repair it. Today Tony can run, jump and play like any other three year old but he is also monitored by the Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Joel is a good student who enjoys video games and hanging out with his older brother Daniel. Joel's left leg is slightly shorter and weaker than his right leg but the doctor's believe that with rehabilitation it will be strengthened.
