Nobles & Ladies,

Hope everyone has had an enjoyable summer! Let's start out this message by complimenting our nobles and ladies at the Rocky Mount Shrine Club for a great May Ceremonial. The weather was perfect and we welcomed 18 new nobles and their ladies/families into this historic fraternity. Remember the key

to our success is keeping all of them interested in what we do! Our nobles and ladies at the Onslow Shrine Club in Jacksonville are working hard in preparation of the upcoming Fall Ceremonial.

This time of year is always busy, busy for everyone. By the time you receive this publication, we will have already attended the 2019 Shriners International Imperial Session in Nashville, TN. Several of our units indicated intent to participate in the huge parade thru the streets of Nashville. I am sure we were the most impressive!

MEMBERSHIP: As everyone is aware our membership efforts to gain new Nobles has to be our top priority equal with raising funds for our Shriners Hospitals for Children. Here are the statistics on membership to date: Members as of January 1, 2019- 3984; New Nobles -55; Restored - 30; Associates - 1; Affiliations - 4; Demits - 5; Suspended - 6; and Deaths - 54. Ending figures as of May 31, 2019 are 4004. We need to dedicate some extra effort and acquire the additional 45 new nobles at our One Day and Fall Ceremonial to meet our goals.

PLAQUE SALES: At this time we already have \$21,068 in funds for our Sudan Plaque Sales. Our goal for 2019 is \$50,000 and I believe from our history we should meet the goal. If anyone needs help, please contact Noble Johnny Albritton at the Wilson Shrine Club.

SUDAN 100-YEAR ANNIVERSARY BOOKS: We still have nearly 500 books available from the original 1000 ordered. I would ask each club and unit to again consider purchasing at least one book for your archives and for people to review. I attended two shrine club meetings since January whereby some widows were in attendance. The subject of the book was announced and they purchased the books. You might also consider presenting one of your noble's or ladies one of these books as a token of recognition for their hard work or dedication to your club or unit, i.e. Past President etc.

CHARITABLE FUNDRAISER'S: Adverse weather really raised havoc and definitely interfered with our Charitable Fundraisers in 2018. I know that Sudan Shriners can make up the difference in 2019. Right now we have accumulated \$69,072 from seven events with eight more pending for the year. Our fall fish fry's, golf tournaments and "Fill the Fez's" should help get those numbers up.

We have some great things coming up in the near future. Our One-Day Ceremonial in New Bern is right around the corner as well as our annual pilgrimage to SASA at Myrtle Beach.


A lot of hard work on Masonic unity within the Masonic bodies in North Carolina has been occurring in the last few years. I would strongly encourage all of us to think Blue Lodge and attend and participate as much as possible. Having said that, our 231st Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge will be conducted in Winston-Salem at the Twin City Quarter (Embassy Suites and Marriott Hotel) on September 27-28, 2019.

Once again, as I close my message, I would ask that we remember our sick, distress and home bound with thoughts and prayers also for our First Responders and military members!






Bryan “Bug” Boor




My name is Jennfer Galens and my son Bryan “Bug” Boor is a Shriner’s kid in Wilmington, NC. The Shriner’s Hospital is an amazing place, and everyone should hear about it! The following is my Bug’s story.

In August of 2014 Bug woke up one morning screaming in pain, and he could not walk. We took him to Camp Lejeune ER, and after a lot of blood work, they said that something was wrong, but they could not determine what. We were told to see our family doctor when they opened the next day. After seeing the family doctor, we were sent to Duke ER to see what they could figure out. Many more tests were administered, many vials of blood, x-rays and MRIs were all completed. But they still could not seem to find out what was wrong. We were sent to pediatric orthopedics Duke. There we were told that there was definitely something showing up, but they thought it was probably arthritis, and we were sent to the peds rheumatoid specialist at Duke. We started the process again and learned that my Bug did not have arthritis but probably did have leukemia. We were in pure shock, and we were off to see another specialist, peds oncology at Duke. With this specialist even more tests ensued. But things were different. For a year we spent every other week driving from Jacksonville to Duke for blood work and scans...and we spent a year thinking that our baby had cancer. Every time we would take him, the tests would come up with different results. We would go one week, and it would be clear he had leukemia, and a week later the tests would show that nothing was wrong. Our family doctor finally said that we should try a different set of doctors and sent us to Chapel Hill. We spent the next year still bouncing between doctors, just at a different hospital. At this point someone very special was coming into my life. It was a Shriner and he and his wife told me all about the Shriner’s Hospital in Greenville, SC. I had always heard of the hospital, as my Dad is a Mason, but I never fully understood what they did. Without me knowing, my Shriner friend made a call to the hospital and gave them my information. He then encouraged me to call and I finally broke down and called. It was the best decision I have ever made

in my life. They had Bug in to see his last doctor, Dr. Laura Hyer, within a week. We were at the hospital for this visit for maybe two and a half hours. And in that time, we learned more than we had in the previous two and a half years. We had brought results from previous blood work, every x-ray and MRI that Bug had ever had. The doctors were able to see the progression and we finally had a diagnosis! Bug has Legg-Calve-Perthes and Hemihyperplasia. When he was four, the blood flow was somehow restricted to his leg and his femur bone died and the femur ball collapsed. It is growing back, but has some irregularities, and is growing a little fast. But all of this is treatable, and it’s something that he can grow out of. With Dr. Hyer we came up with a treatment plan of injections into the hip, administered every few months. Bug had his first injection in April of 2017, and his most recent one was last week. And for the first time in two and a half years my Bug was pain free! Without the Shriners and the Shriner’s Hospital in Greenville, SC we still would not know what was wrong. To all of the Shriners and doctors I will be eternally grateful!

I was nervous and fearful of hearing the same thing I had heard before, that there was not much that could be done. On my first appointment, we arrived to find caring volunteers and a helpful staff. I enjoyed looking around while waiting for my turn to see the doctor. I had x-rays taken and met with the doctor. He had a plan to correct my knees. He started by inserting plates in each knee to straighten them which took about 8 months. I then saw his partner, who tightened each ligament holding my kneecaps in place. My last surgery was in June and now I am doing great!!! I can now run and jump like kids my own age. I will be forever grateful to the doctors, nurses, volunteers, and staff who have helped me through it all.

Hailey Ruckman, age 13 is a beautiful young lady and she has been a Shriners Kid since she was one-year-old. When she was only four-years-old she was diagnosed with a bone disease because the bones between her hip and knee were too long. Shriners Hospitals for Children in Greenville, SC continued to keep an eye on her with a yearly appointment. Her body continued to grow and finally caught up with her legs but when she was in the third grade the doctors realized she had scoliosis. Now we go to the Shriners Hospital for Children in Greenville, SC every six months for a checkup.

Hailey is the kind of girl who strives big with everything she does and will not slow down for anything. We will always be grateful for everything Shriners Hospital has done for our family as well as all the other children that they are helping.

Isabella Thaxton



At the tender age of 18 months lovely Isabella Thaxton became a patient at Shriners Hospitals for Children. She was diagnosed with a bone disease since the bones from her knees to her ankle grew too long and she has had numerous appointments at Shriners Hospital for Children in Greenville, SC to correct it. When

she was preparing to go into the third grade the doctors realized she was a toe walker. They made her two sets of leg braces to try to help her brain realize she had to walk on the bottom of her feet. We as a team with her doctors are helping to correct this. On her recent visit to Shriners Hospitals for Children the doctors realized that she has a small curve in her back that is not quite scoliosis but they are watching it closely.

Isabella is now aged 10 years old and we want to say a special "Thank you" to all the Shriners for everything they do for us and all the other children in the world.



News from Cincinnati

Jason's Story

In 1993, Jason was a typical 12-year-old boy growing up in the Calgary area of Canada. One evening he and his brother Ryan decided to sleep in the family camper in their back yard. Jason's recollection of what happened is still foggy, but he remembers getting up in the early morning hours to use the camper bathroom, which exploded most likely due to a buildup of methane. His parents woke to discover both boys screaming in the back yard.



Maurice, the boys' father, quickly dressed while the boys' mother put Jason in a cold shower. Maurice then drove both children to the hospital.

Ryan was much less severely burned than Jason, who sustained 3rd degree burns to 85% of his body. A physician at the hospital knew about the reputation for pediatric burn care at Shriners Hospitals for Children and contacted a friend who was a Shriner. Soon Jason and his mother were transported by private plane to Shriners Hospitals for Children® — Cincinnati.

Jason remembers waking up at the Cincinnati Shriners Hospital. "The first days, they didn't share any prognosis with my parents, just factual data, because they didn't know if I would ever go home," Jason said, tears welling in his eyes.

Slowly but surely, Jason began to respond to his treatment. Soon, he was playing video games with the boy in the next room, and the nurses would even wheel him out to their station at night when he could not sleep because of the time difference. After 53 days, he was allowed to go home.

Over the next decade, Jason would return for at least 20 additional surgeries, the final one in 2000. "I never let it hold me back," he said. "If someone said, 'you can't,' I would prove them wrong."

Today he is a married father of three, and coach for his kids' hockey team when not working in the HVAC industry. On a recent training trip, Jason and his father decided to pay a visit to the Cincinnati Shriners Hospital. They toured the hospital, recalling details about the then-new building and reconnecting with many of the staff members and volunteers who are still healing children, body and spirit. "I will never forget this place and what it did for me," he said, tearing up once again.


