He was born in Greenville, NC and continues to reside in Pitt County and is currently living in the Grimesland community. He received his education from D. H. Conley High School and East Carolina University. He grew up in the family business where he started working at an early age.

He rode to work with his dad in the summers before he could even drive and would pump gas and wash cars. Stacey is now President and CFO of Pugh's Tire and Service Center, Inc., a fourth generation tire and automotive business started by his grandfather in 1945. He, along with four other family members, oversee the day to day operations of six stores in Pitt, Beaufort and Martin Counties.

Charles "Chuck" Eugene Coddington



Charles "Chuck" Eugene Coddington was born on March 31, 1952 to Arthur George and Georgia Nichols Coddington who resided atop the Appalachian Mountains in western Maryland. Chuck graduated from North Garrett High School in 1970. Shortly thereafter he received an invitation from the United States Army to join a group going to Southeast Asia. He respectfully thanked them and

joined the U. S. Navy. Following several Naval Schools, he finally made it to the fleet. His training prepared him for service on a 640 Class Fleet Ballistic Missile Submarine. In addition to being an electronic technician on submarines he also became a Navy diver. The Navy decorated Chuck with several awards and honors such as the Navy League of the United States for Excellence in Submarines in 1972, Silver Dolphin Badge, two commendations as well as several other honors for service in the line of duty. Thanks to his military service was able to attend college and found it to be easier

than working for a living. Chuck graduated magna cum laude from California State University with a baccalaureate degree in 1976. Chuck received a master's degree from Penn State University in 1977. Also he received a PhD. from University of Maryland in 1980. Chuck was the recipient of a graduate research and teaching assistantship during his master degree and a doctoral fellowship while working on his PhD.

Chuck's employment included the following engineering/technology positions over the past 37 years: Assistant Professor at Middle Tennessee State University, Maryland State Department, Associate Professor/Director Dakota State University, Professor & Chair Morehead State University, Professor & Chair Eastern Illinois University, Professor & Chair East Carolina University, Graduate Director and currently professor/ graduate /undergraduate faculty at East Carolina University. Chuck has chaired 142 master's theses/projects and has served as dissertation research chair for 17 dissertation candidates in three different states and currently chairing three dissertation studies. Chuck professionally belongs to the following organizations: Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers; American Society of Engineering Education; Society of Manufacturing Engineers and the Association of Technology, Management and Applied Engineering.

Chuck is the father of five wonderful children: C. G.; Christopher; Courtney, Chase; & Caitlyn and all of them have at least one college degree and a three of them several degrees. The Navy taught Chuck many things and one of them was if you are not good at tying knots then tie a lot of them. Chuck is married to his beautiful wife Tammy Morton Coddington and they live in Greenville.

Chuck's Masonic journey began in 2008, being raised to the sublimed degree of Master Mason in Greenville at the William Pitt Lodge No. 734 AF & AM. He later moved to the Ayden Lodge No. 498 AF & AM and became Master of the Lodge in 2015, where he remains actively engaged. 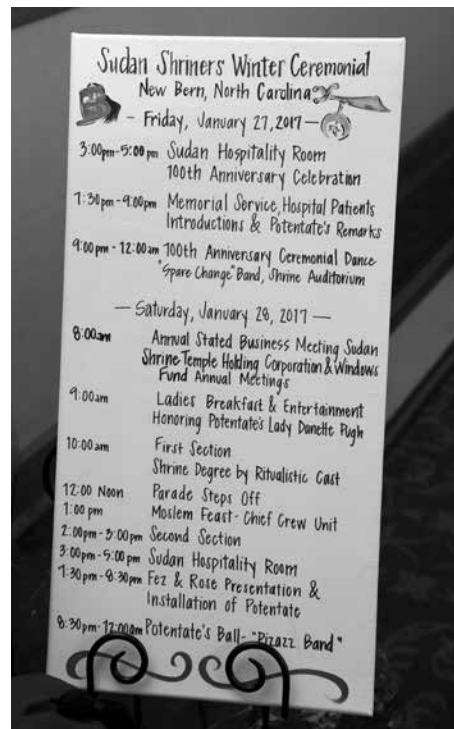

The Story Behind the Shoe



Remington Morgan



On April 3, 2007 Remington was born with bilateral club feet. Hours after she was born, I called to get an appointment with Shriners. Three weeks later we had our first appointment at Shriners. Her first appointment consisted of meeting with the Doctor, getting examined, x-rays, obtaining a plan of action

and last but not least her first set of casts. Over the next three to four months we traveled back to Shriners Hospital in Greenville, SC to have new casts put on. With these travels, the staff at the Hospital became part of our family. After four months it was decided that she would undergo her first surgery to clip the tendon on the back of her foot. In August of 2008, Remington had her "big" surgery. This surgery was more invasive. She would have an incision on each foot in the shape of an "L", dissolvable stitches and a 1-2 night stay at the hospital. The surgery was a huge success. Over the course of the next year she had her casts changed about every 2-3 weeks. After the casts, she was placed back in shoes and a bar. She stayed in the shoes and bar for about a year and a half till the age of 4. At that time the shoes and bars were totally removed and she continued to have checkups every six months and at the age of 6 her appointments went to yearly.

Remington is now 8 years old and continues to be seen at Shriners Hospital every year for checkups. Her progress has been absolutely amazing. There are no words that will ever describe mine and my husband's gratitude towards the Shriners. They helped our little girl to walk, run and play. God has blessed my family as well as millions of others with your kindness. It is an honor to be part of the Shriners family. We truly believe that it is people like the Shriners that make the world a better place.

Jacob Blount



Jacob was born with a foot abnormality. The bottoms of his feet were facing upwards and his lower legs were extremely turned inward. Jacob was referred to Shriners Hospital in Greenville, SC around the age of 15 months. As he grew, many non-surgical techniques were attempted such as stretching his feet, wearing tennis shoes on the wrong feet

and molded braces to help him walk. At the age of two and four, he had tendon release and bone re-alignment surgeries. Jacob was able to ride his bike and scooter, swim in the pool and play in the yard but he could not be a competitive athlete for land sports. He quickly determined that his sport of swimming was the way to be an active student athlete. When he turned 15 he became a lifeguard and taught swimming lessons. He had another surgery at Shriners during his sophomore year of high school. He was non weight bearing, wore a cast and used crutches for half of the school year. He maneuvered up and down stairs at school, even though he was given an elevator key. Jacob excelled in the classroom and rose to the top of his class. He never told his classmates about his foot abnormality, but when he entered the swimming pool to swim for the Clinton Dark Horses, his ability was noted by his fellow athletes. He used his upper body with little to no kick. Because of tendon and ligament constriction, he had little movement and was unable to kick in the pool. His thigh and hip muscles were working to over compensate for the lower legs and feet. He was awarded the Coaches Award for his determination and leadership on the team. He also swam in the state championship relay team his junior and senior year in high school. His high school story ends with an acceptance to UNC Chapel Hill, student body president and the superlative of "Most Likely to Succeed" in the senior class. Jacob exhibits the drive and determination along with a passion to help others which beautifully represents the work of the Shriners. Setting an example to his son, Jacob's father Stuart served on the chef crew and is a member of the Berne Lodge 724. This is a small contribution to the organization that has given our son an opportunity of use his "shoes" to make a difference to other children and families.

Roma was born in the Ukrain on March 21, 2006. He was diagnosed with Arthrogriposis at birth. Arthrogriposis means a child is born with a condition where their joints do not move normally and may be stuck in one position. While living in the Ukrain he had 9 surgeries. was 6 years old. He applied on April 3, 2013 to become a patient of Shriners Hospitals for Children. His first appointment at our Greenville, South Carolina Hospital was on May 3, 2013. Since that first appointment, he has received one surgery and made 19 different trips to the hospital. Our road runners provide transportation for the family to and from the hospital. They are a huge part of the Pitt County Shrine Club family. They love attending the annual Easter Egg Hunt and Christmas party with Santa.

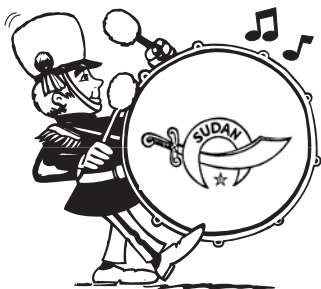

What began as one hospital, is now a world-renowned health care system with 22 locations in three countries. The fraternity, which has nearly 200 chapters in several countries and thousands of clubs around the world, continues to support this unique health care system. Boilerplate for Shriners Hospitals for Children: Shriners Hospitals for Children provides specialized care to children with orthopaedic conditions, burns, spinal cord injuries, and cleft lip and palate, regardless of the families' ability to pay. Generally, care is provided until age 18, although, in some cases, it may be extended to age 21. All care and services are provided in a family-centered environment. 


