

### Pay It Forward - Already Paid



A few years ago I had the pleasure of coaching in the degrees two men - a father and son. Interestingly each decided to seek admission and light in masonry independently and without the knowledge of the other. Each had been motivated by a different set of men. Each was surprised to learn of the others' intentions. Later, after the second degree, the two were sharing coffee

early one morning. The older was remarking about the rich heritage, the great symbolism, and goodness he was learning about our institution. The younger agreed saying, "it's like we get to join now and pay it forward." PAY IT FORWARD!

A miserly old man began placing money in pillowcases in his attic. He told his family, "when I die I'll grab it on my way." He was planning for his afterlife of luxury. After his death the family looked in the attic. The money was still there. His wife said, "I told that old fool he should've put the money in the basement."

This is not what I mean by paying it forward. It must be done in sincerity without expectation of return. I refer to the concept of sowing seeds of kindness today and reaping rewards later. This is a concept encapsulating a universal truth. When you do a good deed, it causes another to do the same and then another and so it spreads. Eventually, the kindness returns full circle.

Pay it forward is a trendy concept now also popularized by a movie a few years back by the same name. The movie was based upon a book by Catherine Ryan Hide, with a simple plot. As part of a social studies assignment, a young boy, suggests that as a way of changing the world one would do a favor for another without being asked, and in return that person would be expected to do a favor for three others and so on. Liberty Mutual Insurance Co. has capitalized on this theme with a commercial that is showing the effects of random acts of kindness spreading and causing others to do the same. The message is that this makes a difference in the world, one act at a time multiplied. Although trendy this is not new to us. As Masons we are taught at every stage to practice the principle of the cabletow.

In past travels, I was told a story by a Past Grand Master and Past Potentate of a Shrine temple from a nearby southern jurisdiction. It is a story which he is all too pleased to tell but can't do so without tears in his eyes. For his service he received a Potentates Jewel. It is indeed among his most prized possessions. He kept it locked in a safe in his place of business. One night he was burglarized and it was stolen along with money and other things. The insurance company tried to pay him for it, but he refused, adamantly stating, "I know I will get it back one day." They thought he was foolish.

Approximately two years later a phone call came and a man said. "I believe I have something that belongs to you." He described the jewel. Immediately the Past Potentate said, "I only have two questions. How much do you want and where or how would you like me to meet you to receive it?" The voice at the other end said simply, "first of all, I'll bring it to you and secondly you don't owe me anything." Soon he arrived at the Past Potentate's house and there he saw the beautiful jewel again. It had been cleaned obviously. With tears in his eyes the Past Potentate said, "You don't know how much this means to me. This is priceless; surely you must allow me to pay you something for it." But the man simply said "I've already been paid." He explained that he had found this under a creek bed where the river's waters had receded while he was fishing with his grandson. He described his efforts in locating it owner. The Past Potentate again insisted that he should be paid. And the man said, "No you don't understand, I have already been paid." Whereupon the stranger pulled from his wallet an old yellowed photo. It showed a young child with dreadfully mangled legs, so much so that he couldn't walk. He was forced to sit in a makeshift homemade wheelchair. The man went on to explain, this was me. Our family had no money for treatment. One day a man came and said that he was a Mason and Shriner and he thought his friends could help me. Although my parents were unable to afford treatment that man and his friends did help me. After treatment I was able to walk, run and play as others. I graduated from school and got a good job at the factory. I met my wonderful wife. Today I have three children and several grandchildren. One of my children is a preacher, one is a respected lawyer and legislator, the other is a surgeon. All of that is possible only because of people like you. So you see, I've already been paid. Nobles, the corollary of "Pay it Forward" is "I've already been paid."

Someone somewhere has received the benefit of what you have done. Some Shrine/Mason has already paid for the benefits we or our families may reap today. There are multiple recipients from gifts paid forward. The recipient receives an immediate benefit when his quality of life is improved and his family and friends receive a delayed benefit. The giver receives the less intrinsic benefits attributable to givers. When witnessed by others this motivates them to act.

In the Great Light 2nd Corinthians, Ch. 9 v. 10 - it is explained. "Your gifts will be multiplied." "He that ministers seed to the sower both ministers bread for your food and multiply your seed sown and increase the fruit of your labor."

Luke the physician and traveling companion of the Apostle Paul, recorded the words of Jesus, "Give and it shall be given unto you, in good measure, pressed down, shaken and running over." Luke 6:38

Thank you, for paying it forward, and making a difference in the lives of many, one life at a time. May God continue to bless your toil.

Membership is still Sudan's top priority We only had twelve new nobles, three affiliates and one associate at our May ceremonial. Everyone needs to start work on our One Day Ceremonial starting now for September 12<sup>th</sup>! Nobles Jonathan Johnson, Neal Combs, Brian Honeycutt and Chris East, from our Masonic Relations and Membership Committees are with 12 other Sudan nobles and members of our Divan, working to re-store as many of the suspended nobles as possible from the last two years. They need more dedicated nobles to help!

Sudan will be at the annual North Carolina Grand Lodge Meeting in September with a booth to distribute literature and talk about Shrinedom with our Blue Lodge Masons. All three North Carolina Shrine temples are participating in this project.

Have you been to Blue Lodge in a while? Reconnect with your lodge if you haven't already done so. Remember, that is where we all came from and that is where we are going to find our new candidates. You might want to have a joint family day event or gathering at your shrine club and the lodges in your area. This has proven to have helped with some temples in their membership efforts.

Shriners International is in the process of a complete changeover with our computer program. This is a huge project. 

### Sudan Wrecking Crew is 90

Then Photo - May 1924



Our Sudan Wrecking Crew is celebrating their 90th year of existence with an outstanding past and bright fore-seeable future. The photo above was taken in 1924 with Illustrious Sir Jake Lassiter seated in the center surrounded by a very energetic bunch of nobles. It has been said they were thinking about how they would welcome the next group of nobles into our fraternity. Probably good thoughts all the way! This black and white photo was donated to Wayne Shrine Club, the original home of the Wrecking Crew, by PP "Bill" William A. Prince on February 7, 1984.

Numbers were written on each of the nobles in the photo as follows: (1) Clark Dirchaw; (2) Unknown; (3) John Maxwell; (4) Woodard; (5) Billy Carr; (6) Unknown; (7) Nick Gwaltney; (8) Unknown; (9) Claude Chamberlain; (10) Wray Holt; (11) Leslie Livingston; (12) M.D. Aycock; (13) Vaughn Woodard; (14) McDewett, and (15) Jarvis Harrmwell. I am not sure but the names actually coincide with the photo since this photo was actually believed to be taken in 1924. Photo #9 appears to be Past Potentate Jake Lassiter from Rocky Mount. Another document was located at the temple, revealing 25 names as being charter members. Those names are not listed here.


I have not included all of the comments, but some made at the time when the unit was activated in 1925, were "Sudan gave birth to a new unit known as the Wrecking Crew, it was destined to be regarded by the candidates as possessing horns, and definitely not to be trusted". I cannot even imagine why they developed this image. Noble Claude Chamberlain became their first Director, and from

the moment of its birth, when it took over the second section of initiation, it became an indispensable part of each ceremonial. Since 1925, our Sudan Wrecking Crew has conducted initiation 27,458 nobles thru the second section into the Sudan Temple. If anyone has any other photos of this unit, please consider providing it to the temple for the archives.



## Hugo's Story



Sudan Shriners has about 561 children in eastern North Carolina under the care of Shriners Hospitals for Children. This care is provided for the children regardless of the parent's ability to pay. The Onslow County Shrine Club has 49 active patients with the Shriners Hospitals for Children (SHC). These patients include a 21 year old young man, burns on his head from hot grease spill in 1995, an 8 year-old girl with severe burn injuries to her leg and foot. Two patients that are treated at the Boston SHC for

large birthmarks, one being treated at the Cincinnati SHC for cleft palate, and Hugo Rubirosa of Jacksonville for a spinal cord injury at the Philadelphia SHC.

Carolyn (Staff Writer) spoke with Hugo after he returned from a field trip to Duplin Winery with his business accounting class at Coastal Carolina Community College. On Jan. 3, 2012, Hugo was a junior at Jacksonville High School with a bright future as a student athlete. He was in advanced placement courses with a GPA above 6.0, and scheduled to graduate from high school and the Geneva (Switzerland) International Baccalaureate program. At a wrestling bout that evening at West Carteret High School, his neck was broken. The other wrestler had him in a headlock when he stumbled and both wrestlers fell on his head shattering two vertebrae and fracturing two more leaving him paralyzed from the neck down.

Hugo, fully aware and not in pain, was taken to Carteret General Hospital and then airlifted to Pitt Memorial Hospital in Greenville where he remained for four months. His body may have been broken but not his spirit. While there, Hugo worked with the Children's Miracle Network Association appearing on TV, radio and the backs of Cheez It and Waffle boxes. Pitt Memorial still calls on Hugo to encourage new patients that may have given up. "It was really cool," Hugo said of the Children's Miracle Network.

Hugo never stopped going to school. He had to drop out of the International Baccalaureate program because the class load was too rigorous but continued with his high school classes and graduated in 2013.

Within sixth months, Hugo had recovered feeling through his hips and all the way to his feet. He could move his arms and control some of his torso. He still cannot walk nor feel temperatures and pain and the area of injury still cause spasms throughout his body. "It is the most annoying thing in the world," he said.

An older man named Fred, 96, often visited Hugo in the hospital at Pitt Memorial. Fred was a former Mason and encouraged Hugo and his family to contact the Shriners Hospitals for Children to see if they could help him, which they did. Meanwhile, Hugo went to the Shepherd Center in Atlanta for eight weeks for spinal cord rehabilitation.

The Shriners Hospitals for Children accepted Hugo as a patient and sent him to the Shriners Hospital for Children in Philadelphia for a month for evaluation. A surgeon there that specializes in hands and arms scheduled Hugo to come back for four months to reroute some of the muscles in his arms and hand. Hugo's bicep was working but not the triceps. The bicep was reconnected and the thumb modified so that Hugo can pinch and pick up things. Only one thumb was reconnected because the other works some.

"I had a cast to my shoulders on both sides," Hugo said. "I had to have people feed me again. It was terrible."

After recovering from the surgery, Hugo said, "The improvements on my arms are amazing. It makes quite a difference. I can get back to weightlifting with my therapist. I am trying to stand up a little."

Hugo has a standing wheelchair to improve his circulation. He continues with physical therapy and has gone twice a month for four months to the Shriners hospital in South Carolina for follow up. Hugo also works with Vocational Rehabilitation in Jacksonville and in New Bern. He is attending college to earn his Associates degree in business and accounting and works at as a tutor.

"You want to make a difference, donate money to these people," Hugo said. "Every dollar counts, every person counts. It is a charity that helps thousands of children each year. It is awesome to see how much it does to help people. It makes people's life better."

Right after Hugo was injured, area schools and businesses rallied around the family holding several fundraisers to defray medical costs both in Jacksonville and Swansboro. "Hope for Hugo" bracelets and T-shirts were sold with Hugo's favorite saying, "Coach, I got this." Papa John's Pizza in Swansboro sponsored a fundraiser.

There were also fundraising runs to purchase a handicap accessible van. National Dodge held a fundraiser at the dealership selling hot dogs, hamburgers and pizza that doubled what was raised. "We had a good ol' time that day," Hugo said. Vocational Rehab and Independent Living helped and after much patience, Hugo got the van and then waited for it to be converted so that he could get in it. His mother drives him but Hugo would like to drive himself so now he is working and waiting on getting the van converted so that he can drive it.

"The support was overwhelming," Hugo said. "I am real thankful for all the help. I thank God and all the people."




