

We are getting ready for another ceremonial. The Fall Ceremonial is already upon us with the Johnston County Shrine Club, nobles and ladies working hard to do it right! This is in a really good central location so maybe we can bust out a record attendance and pick up a lot of new nobles.

We unfortunately have had four units fold this year, mainly due to aging of the Nobles. 





This article has the correct title! As of September 13, we have lost 106 to the Black Camel and have over 300 who are still NPD. Nobles, we can't handle these numbers and survive. Last year, Sudan suspended 171 for NPD's and had a total of 205 losses with an additional 171 deaths.

As I sat through the 2014 Imperial Session in Minneapolis, and listened to the Shriners International Membership presentation, the numbers of losses was actually frightening. There are some of the smaller temples experiencing gains but the larger losing at an alarming rate. I did hear several say, "We need to work on it." But I didn't hear of any secret remedies.



Shriners Hospital for Children – Greenville

Greetings from your Shriners Hospital for Children in Greenville (SHC-G). This continues to be an exciting time in Greenville for all Nobles, Physicians, Staff, and of course, our children. We're seeing record numbers of patients, experiencing record levels of patient satisfaction, collecting more money from insurance which equates to more financial stability, and most importantly, providing new and improved treatment options for our children.

Perhaps one of the most exciting developments is a new treatment option for children with scoliosis. Scoliosis is a severe curvature of the spine and if left untreated, children with this disease can face a lifetime of pain and deformity. Usual treatment has consisted of casting if the deformity is caught at an early enough age and surgery to implant metal rods when the child is older.

The casting, known as Risser Casting is done under general anesthesia in the operating room. The casts are changed every two to three months, again under general anesthesia in the operating room. This allows the spine to grow while allowing the surgeons to manage the deformity. This option only works for certain patients.

By the time the child reaches age 8-10, spinal surgery is usually performed that requires implanting rods to fuse the spine. This surgery can be lengthy and painful for the child. Once the rods are placed, the child must undergo additional surgeries every four to six months to lengthen the spine until they finish growing. With each of the estimated 10 surgeries, comes more time away from school, more pain, more anxiety, and more risk of complications.

A new "device" was recently approved by the FDA that is a great improvement for scoliosis patients. The new device is the Magnetic Expansion Control, or MAGEC Spinal Bracing and Distraction System. This is a fancy name but an incredibly advanced system that allows doctors to lengthen the spine using two telescoping magnetic rods that are fused into the spine. The beauty of this system is that the rods can be lengthened (usually every two months) by activating a magnet that is implanted under the skin. This is operated from outside the body with no incisions, no anesthesia, no inpatient stay, no recovery, and most importantly, no pain. The

movement is very gradual and the child doesn't feel it at all.

This is such an improvement for the child and their parents. There is a down side, the cost associated with this procedure. The total cost of the surgery using the MAGEC system is over \$50,000 compared to \$15,000 with the more conventional rods. But that's what makes our Hospitals and our Fraternity so great. We'll just have more fish fry's, sell more tickets, or do what we need to do to take care of our children. That's what Shriners have done for Shriners Hospitals for Children since our first hospital opened in 1922.

- 2. Dealt with mileage and per diem of the representatives and was a simple wording change to clarify intent. Item passed.
- 4, 5 and 6: All dealt with the establishment of procedures in the event temples wanted to voluntarily consolidate, merge or surrender its charter. All three items passed.
- 7. Pertained to an increase in per capita tax from \$15.00 to \$27.00. This item was defeated.

- 14. Would have allowed shrine temples, clubs or units to have fundraising events for "Wounded Warriors", after much debate this item was defeated.
- 17. Dispensation to open a new temple in Brazil and was passed.
- 18 through 20 were Colorado Items and were dispensed with as follows:
- (18) Pay mileage and per diem for hospital chairmen and vice chairmen, who attend the annual meeting of the corporation. This item passed.
- (19) Changing the age limit for the office of Board of Trustees for Shriners Hospital for Children. Currently the limit is 72. The amendment would have allowed one who had already been elected to serve up to three consecutive terms even if he reached 72. After written ballot this item failed.
