

Shrine Membership is Everyone's Business

First, I understand in the future editions of this Red Fez we will include an article on Membership. Thank you! Secondly, let me thank our Sudan Membership Team for the hard work demonstrated in the beginning of the year prior to the outbreak of this deadly virus. Our Divan and Illustrious Sir Buddy Brown are committed to increasing our membership but it is every one of us that have to take a big bite out of the apple and help this issue! We have listed our Sudan Membership Team on the same page as our Divan Governor's beneath the Area Governor's name and this can be found on page 22 of this issue. We would love to talk with membership and listen to your comments. If you would like to be part of our team, please contact our team members.

Sudan is the fifth largest Shrine temple in Shriners International with 3782 members. We have approximately 37,000 Master Masons in North Carolina which gives us the potential and an opportunity to increase the membership. Sudan, Amran, and Oasis Shriners collectively have 9400 of Masons who are Shriners. We are also being challenged by Imperial Potentate Jeffery Sowder to work his initiative "Just One". He is asking each Shriner to enlist "Just One" Shrine candidate. I am asking you to canvas your Lodges and Brothers to solicit candidates for Sudan! Although our Spring Ceremonial was cancelled, we still have our Cold Sands in September, and our Fall Ceremonial in November remaining in 2020.

Parallel with the "Just One" initiative, our Membership Team is focusing on four critical steps for a healthy Shrine organization: (1) Recruitment, (2) Retention, (3) Restoration and (4) Relationships. To fully explain and

expand on these topics, I will be sending a letter to each club president and unit head to share this with your membership.

When we find a Shriner on the NPD (Non-Payment of Dues) list, it is important that we attempt to restore the Noble as soon as possible. The list of NPDs for clubs and units needs immediate follow-up with verbal or personal contact with the Noble. Ask them why did he loose interest or did we as a group or individual do something to make them uncomfortable and not meet the expectations they had when joining. With an effort from all of us, we should be able to restore at a minimum half of 113 Nobles who were suspended at the end of 2019. That would account for an increase of 56 Nobles for our 2020 membership efforts.

We must eliminate the mentality of "we and they" and be open minded to the new members and potential leaders of this fraternity, who in turn will keep our commitment of caring for the children that need our help!

Hopefully, we are nearing the re-emergence of a normal lifestyle once again where we can fellowship with each other and work once more for our most precious resources, our children who are patients at our Shriners Hospitals for Children. Sudan will survive this pandemic and we will learn from this huge challenge and become smarter and stronger.




















Shriners Hospitals for Children Patients

The following were provided by parents/guardians concerning their child's care and medical treatment at Shriners Hospitals for Children.

Brantlee



This beautiful baby boy was born October 6, 2017 under unkind conditions because his mother suffered a sudden cardiac arrest and was without oxygen for an unknown period of time. Brantlee was 35 weeks in gestation when his little body suffered the same conditions as his mother. She required CPR and defibrillation to resuscitate her. Brantlee was taken by c-section in hopes that

he and his mother would pull through and by the grace of God – they did make it but not unscathed. Brantlee and his mother both suffered anoxic brain injuries.

In the beginning, Brantlee had spontaneous breathing but it was unsure if he could breathe without oxygen support and c-pap therapy. He also had several episodes of SVT (irregular heart beat) and seizure activity. Brantlee was hospitalized for a month and on November 3, 2017 he was able to come home with medicine for his heart and seizures. Within a year he was able to come off of the medications and Brantlee continues to grow and learn.

He can walk, talk and do everything you want your baby to do but he has progressed at a slower pace. He is a patient at Shriners Hospitals for Children in Greenville, SC and proving to be such a tough little guy. He brings joy to everyone he encounters.

I have many memories about the Shriners between being in parades and of course, there were countess trips to the hospital. Vondashia






